

Welcome to the Park

Chilliwack Provincial Park is located in the upper Chilliwack River Valley and borders the northern boundary of North Cascades National Park in the United States.

Chilliwack River Ecological Reserve, situated within the Chilliwack Lake park boundaries, protects a unique old-growth forest. The reserve's location provides high annual rainfall supporting temperate rainforest ecosystems. The site has been selected for scientific research on tree genetics.

Things to Do



All estimates below are based on a **return** trip.

Post Creek to Greendrop Lake offers beautiful views of Lindeman and Greendrop Lakes.

10.4 km 6 hours 365 m

Post Creek to Flora Lake rewards hikers with great views of Chilliwack Lake and surrounding mountains from the alpine meadows at Flora Lake.

14 km 11 hours 1,050 m

Chilliwack River Foot Bridge to Radium Lake offers vistas of magnificent peaks, including a glacier.

12 km 6 hours 900 m



Swimming area is roped off at a sandy beach.



Adventure playground is available for both campers and day visitors.



Canoes and kayaks are welcome; be cautious of dangerous currents at the outflow of Chilliwack Lake.



Chilliwack Lake has Dolly Varden, kokanee, rainbow and cutthroat trout. An appropriate licence is required.



Chilliwack Lake usually has strong winds in the afternoon - perfect for windsurfing!

Visitor Services



There are 146 sites, each with a picnic table and fire ring. There are 6 backcountry sites (no facilities) in the park. Campfires are not permitted in backcountry.



Visitors can use sani-station for a fee.



Boat launch is designed for boats <23 feet in length.



Pit toilets in the Radium Loop are all wheelchair accessible. Trails are not accessible.

Enjoy Your Stay

Park regulations protect the natural state of the park and ensure the quality experience for all visitors.

- Campfires are permitted in designated fire rings only.
- Pets must be on a leash at all times. Please be responsible for their behaviour and waste.
- Swimming may not be safe in all areas; there is a strong current at the head of Chilliwack River.
- Stay on trails as they lead through the most appealing parts of the park without damaging sensitive plant and wildlife habitats.
- Practice no-trace camping; **Pack it in, Pack it out**

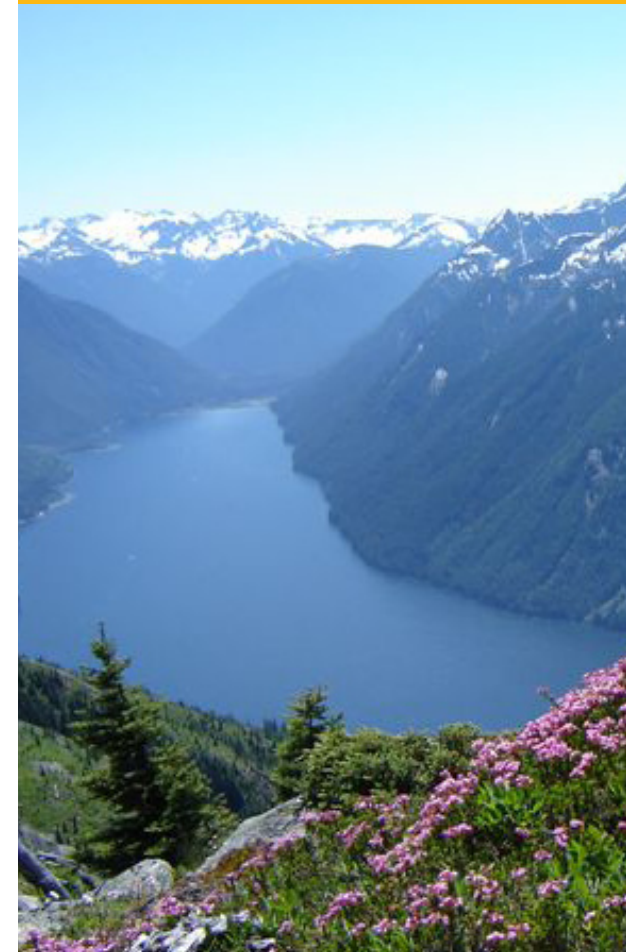
