

CYPRESS PROVINCIAL PARK TRAIL REPORT

June 5th, 2017

Sunrise: 5:09 AM - Sunset: 9:13 PM

PLEASE BE AWARE:

- Plan ahead – ensure you have enough time to return before dark!
- Unpredictable weather may occur at any time of year. Be self-sufficient and prepared for storms, poor visibility and an unexpected overnight stay.
- Natural hazards such as exposed rocks, roots, windfalls and dead standing trees may be encountered on all trails at any time. Use at your own risk.
- Trail assessment / clearing has not yet been completed on all trails, as indicated

Dog Owners:

- **All Dogs Must be on Leash at All Times in the Park.**
- **Pick up your dog's droppings and dispose of them in a garbage can.**
- **Failure to comply will result in fines under the Park Act.**

Hiking Trail Conditions:

Baden Powell / Cabin Lake Trail (Ski Area to Eagle Bluffs): All trails in this area are at least partially snow-covered. BC Parks trail assessment has yet to occur this year.

Baden Powell / Hollyburn Mtn Trail: All trails in this area are at least partially snow-covered. BC Parks trail assessment has yet to occur this year.

Notice: several un-bridged creek crossings between Hollyburn trail and the Alpine Ski Area may be difficult or impassible during times of high water. Use caution, and if in doubt do not attempt to cross!

Blue Gentian & West Lake: All trails in this area are at least partially snow-covered. Route-finding may be difficult for those unfamiliar with the area. Where trail is exposed, expect muddy and slippery conditions. **Sturdy footwear is highly recommended.**

Howe Sound Crest Trail – South: Trail is snow covered and travels through avalanche terrain. **Travel is not recommended past Bowen Lookout until snow has melted**

Howe Sound Crest Trail – North (Deeks Lake): BC Parks trail assessment has yet to occur this season. Expect trees on trail & muddy conditions, as well as snow cover at higher elevation.

Please Note: Day use parking for the northern trailhead is located near the Porteau Road highway exit. Please park in the small lot at the end of the pavement and hike up the gravel road to find the signposts for the trail. The closest overnight parking is at Porteau Cove Provincial Park.

Lost Lake Trail: Muddy and slippery conditions in some sections, snow covered in others. **Sturdy footwear is highly recommended.**

Notice: 2 un-bridged creek crossings may be difficult or impassible during times of high water. Use caution, and if in doubt do not attempt to cross!

Yew Lake Trail: Partial snow cover. Dogs are not permitted on the Yew Lake Trail.
