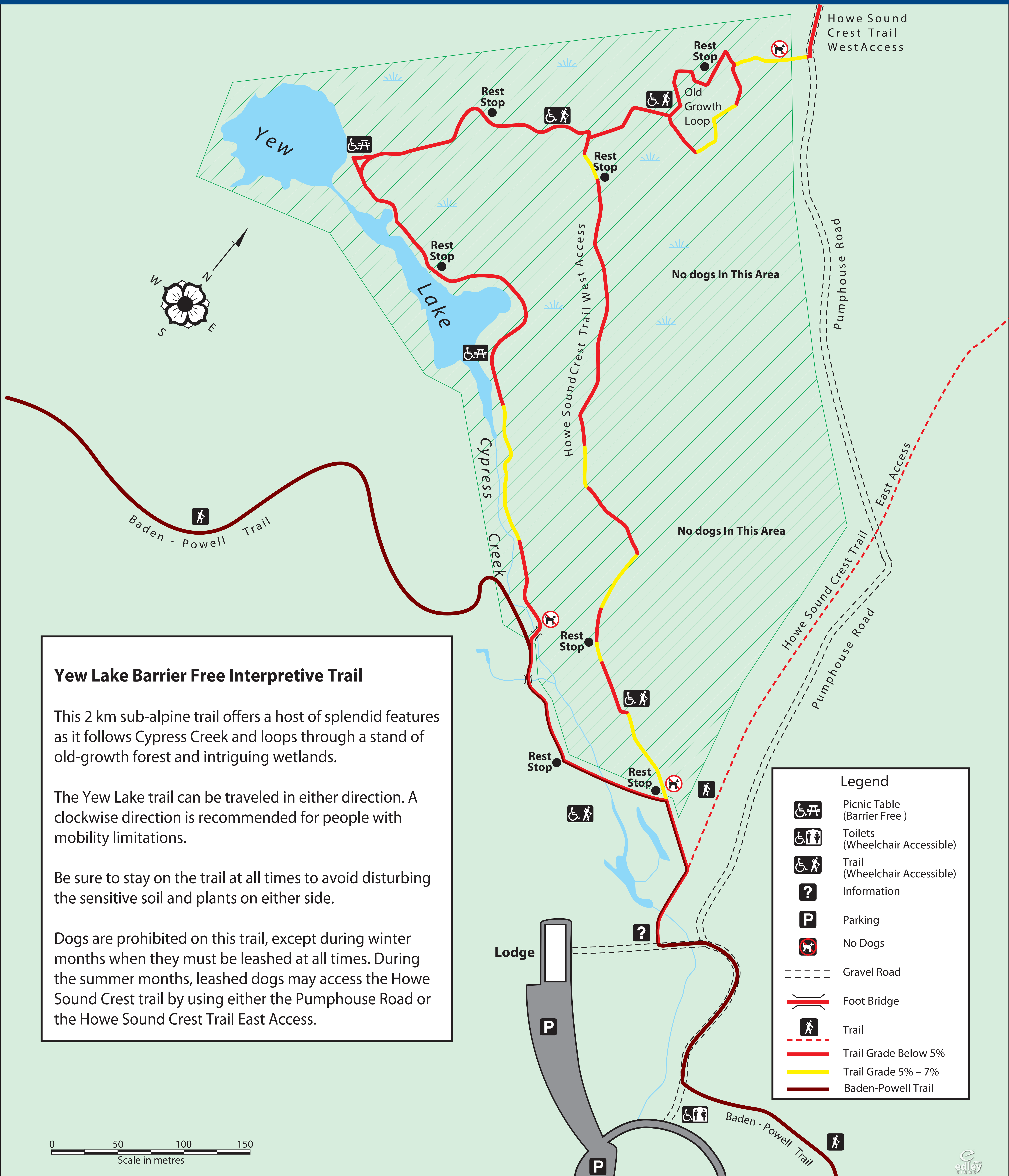


# Yew Lake Barrier Free Interpretive Trail



**Yew Lake Barrier Free Interpretive Trail**

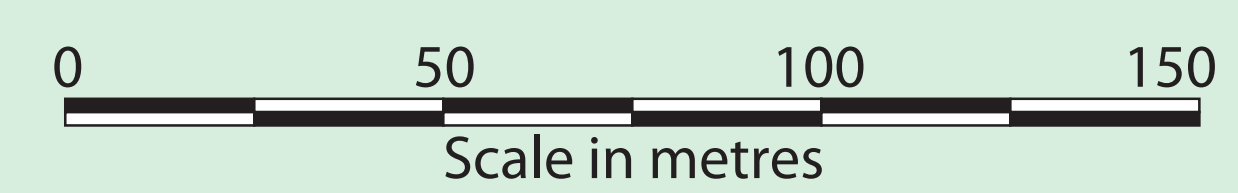
This 2 km sub-alpine trail offers a host of splendid features as it follows Cypress Creek and loops through a stand of old-growth forest and intriguing wetlands.

The Yew Lake trail can be traveled in either direction. A clockwise direction is recommended for people with mobility limitations.

Be sure to stay on the trail at all times to avoid disturbing the sensitive soil and plants on either side.

Dogs are prohibited on this trail, except during winter months when they must be leashed at all times. During the summer months, leashed dogs may access the Howe Sound Crest trail by using either the Pumphouse Road or the Howe Sound Crest Trail East Access.
