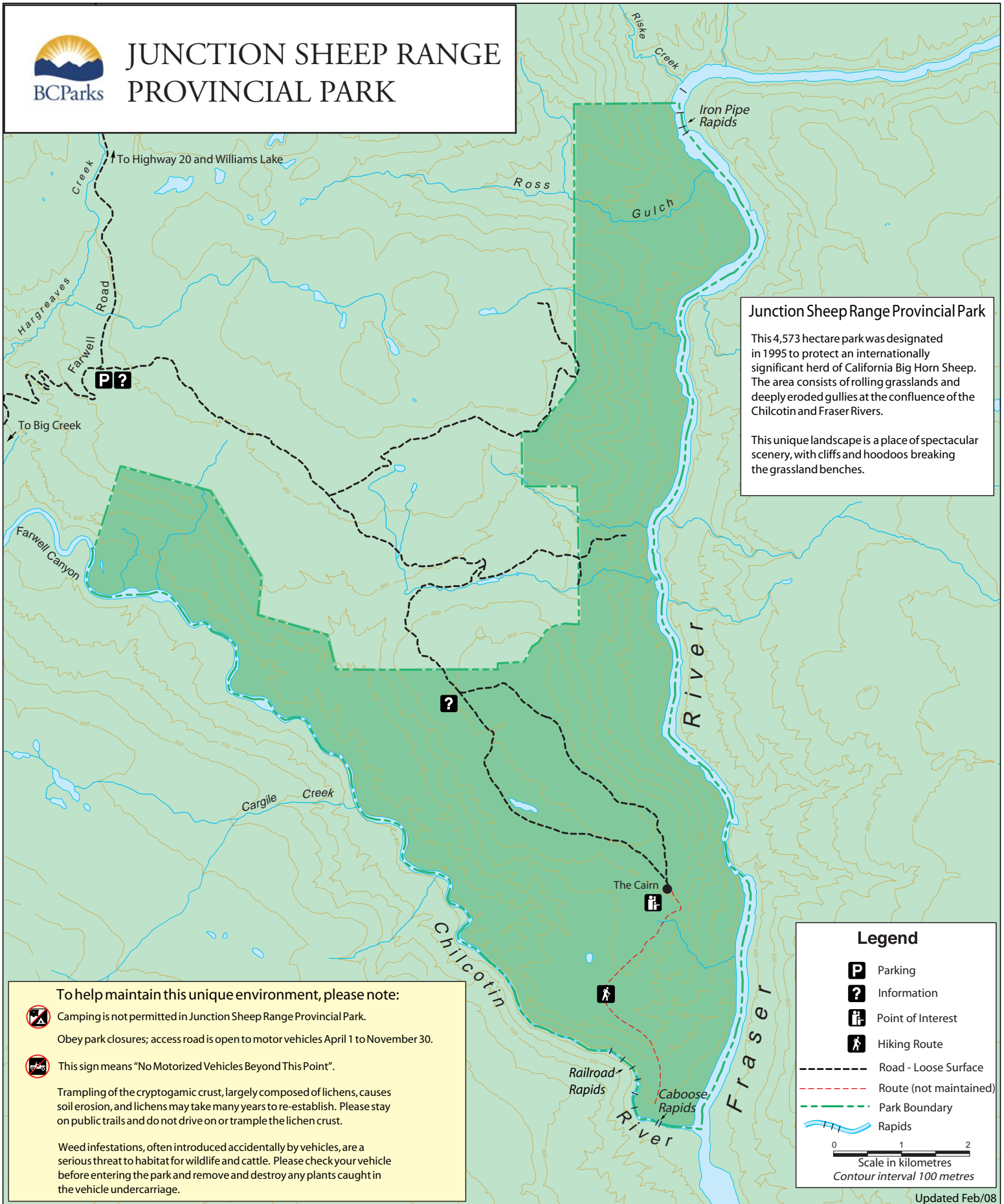




# JUNCTION SHEEP RANGE PROVINCIAL PARK



**Junction Sheep Range Provincial Park**

This 4,573 hectare park was designated in 1995 to protect an internationally significant herd of California Big Horn Sheep. The area consists of rolling grasslands and deeply eroded gullies at the confluence of the Chilcotin and Fraser Rivers.

This unique landscape is a place of spectacular scenery, with cliffs and hoodoos breaking the grassland benches.

**To help maintain this unique environment, please note:**

- Camping is not permitted in Junction Sheep Range Provincial Park.
- Obey park closures; access road is open to motor vehicles April 1 to November 30.
- This sign means "No Motorized Vehicles Beyond This Point".
- Trampling of the cryptogamic crust, largely composed of lichens, causes soil erosion, and lichens may take many years to re-establish. Please stay on public trails and do not drive on or trample the lichen crust.
- Weed infestations, often introduced accidentally by vehicles, are a serious threat to habitat for wildlife and cattle. Please check your vehicle before entering the park and remove and destroy any plants caught in the vehicle undercarriage.
