



Lac le Jeune

PROVINCIAL PARK

Established in 1956, Lac Le Jeune Provincial Park contains a campground with 144 campsites, a lakeside picnic area, a playground and trails in a 47 hectare lodgepole pine forested area. A 1996 addition of 166 hectares across the lake will remain in a natural state.

Nestled among the pines, Lac Le Jeune Park appeals to campers and anglers seeking an easily accessible getaway spot with a diverse assortment of year-round recreational activities. The waters of Lac Le Jeune are known for their “fighting Rainbow Trout” and great canoeing. A walk along the lake trail will incite an appreciation for the variety of plants and wildlife in the area.

Nearby Stake Lake Trails provide 160 km of signed trails for hikers and mountain bikers during the summer, and groomed tracks for cross-country skiers during the winter.

Services such as gas, propane and food may be found at the communities of Kamloops, Merritt or Logan Lake.

Management Messages

We hope you enjoy your visit to Lac Le Jeune Park. BC Parks is dedicated to preserving the natural state of parks while providing recreational access to their features. Park regulations and policies protect park values, ensuring a quality experience for all visitors, both today and in years to come.

Water Safety - Boaters are restricted to outside of the marker buoys. As the Park does not provide lifeguards, all children must be supervised. Safe swimming and boating procedures should be practiced at all times.

Recycling - Blue recycling containers are located at the garbage corrals for all your refundable containers. Recycling stations are located at the sani-station and across from campsite #6.

Bears - Remember, you're in bear country. Be sure to properly store your food and cooking utensils, ideally in your vehicle, when you are sleeping or away from your campsite even for a brief period. Ensure that garbage is disposed of promptly in the garbage containers provided. Please note that small children may be unable to open the bear-proof garbage containers. Feeding of all wildlife is prohibited. Remember that these are wild animals and may be dangerous. Please do not get too close, and report any sighting of a bear to the Park Facility Operator or host.

ATVs and Dirt Bikes may not be operated in Lac Le Jeune Park. Only registered motor vehicles may be operated in this park. Trail facilities for off-road vehicles are available nearby at Chuwels Mountain Rec Site.

Firearms - The handling and discharge of firearms, pellet guns and air rifles are prohibited in the park.

Help BC Parks protect the environment. Please use bikes on pavement or designated trails only. Protect vegetation around your campsite by keeping all tents, vehicles and equipment on the gravel pad. Reducing your firewood consumption helps preserve both our forests and our clean air.

Campground Information

Park Hosts are located in campsite #6. They will be pleased to answer any questions you may have on facilities, services and recreation opportunities in the park and surrounding area.

Length of Stay is limited to a total of 14 days in a calendar year.

Check-out Time is 11 am. If a campsite has not been re-registered by this time it may be reassigned, unless special arrangements have been made with park operators.

Reservations are encouraged. Please call the toll-free reservation line at 1-800-689-9025.

Visitors must leave by 11 pm. Only registered campers are allowed in the park after 11 pm. The park security gate is closed between 11 pm and 7 am.

Tents, Vehicles and Equipment must remain on the gravel portion of your campsite unless authorized.

Camping Fees and Party Size - Due to wear and tear, maintenance and conservation factors within our parks, limits must be placed on the party size, ie. the number of people and vehicles each campsite can accommodate.

1-4 persons 16 years of age or older; maximum of 8 persons including children (15 years of age and younger).

One vehicle and trailer, either one (but not both) may be an RV. A secondvehicle (non-RV) may be allowed on site for an additional nightly charge of half the campsite fee.

Only one party is allowed per campsite unless authorized by the Park Facility Operator. Remember, if you arrive with more people or vehicles than you have reserved for, accommodations may not be available.

Pets must be kept on a leash while in the park and are not permitted in the day use area or on the beach. Please collect any feces your pet leaves on trails and roadways and deposit in garbage containers.

Excessive Noise is not permitted. Please remember that sound travels farther in open air, especially music, loud talking and laughter. Quiet hours are between 10 pm and 7 am. Noise must not carry beyond your site.

Liquor Consumption is not permitted in the park except in registered campsites.

Campfires must not exceed half a metre in height. Keep fires small, save trees and conserve firewood. Do not leave your campfire unattended. This is a high risk forest fire area. Firewood can be purchased from the Park Facility Operator.

Trees and Shrubs are easily damaged; do not use them for wiener sticks or clothesline supports. Flowers, trees and shrubs are part of the park's natural heritage. Please do not damage or remove them.

Valuables should not be left unattended. Report all thefts to the Park Facility Operator as soon as possible.

Anglers should possess valid BC angling licenses which are required for angling in all waters in BC.

A 240' fishing wharf has been provided for the physically challenged to angle from. Please respect this facility and its intended use. All activities other than fishing are prohibited.

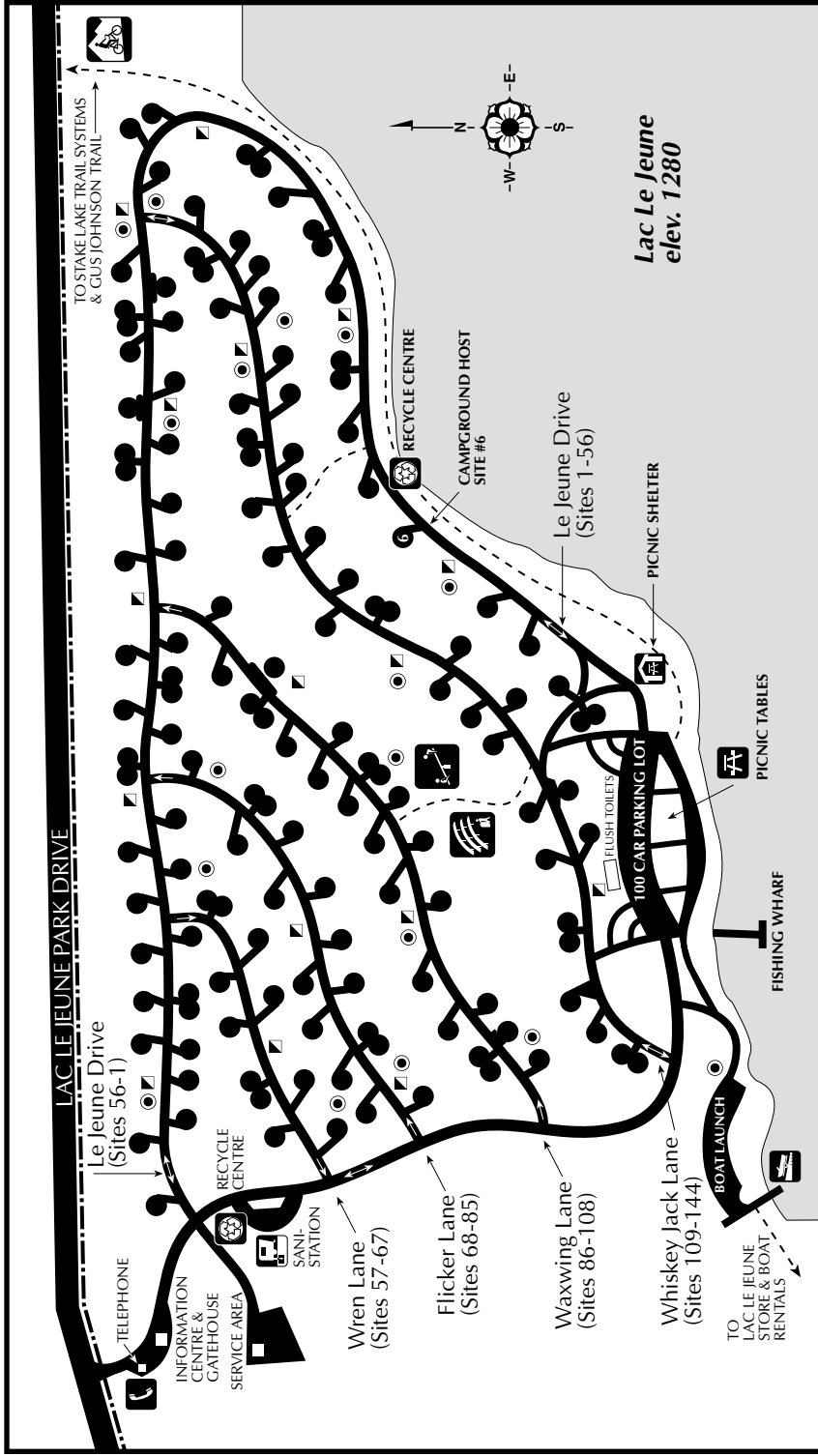
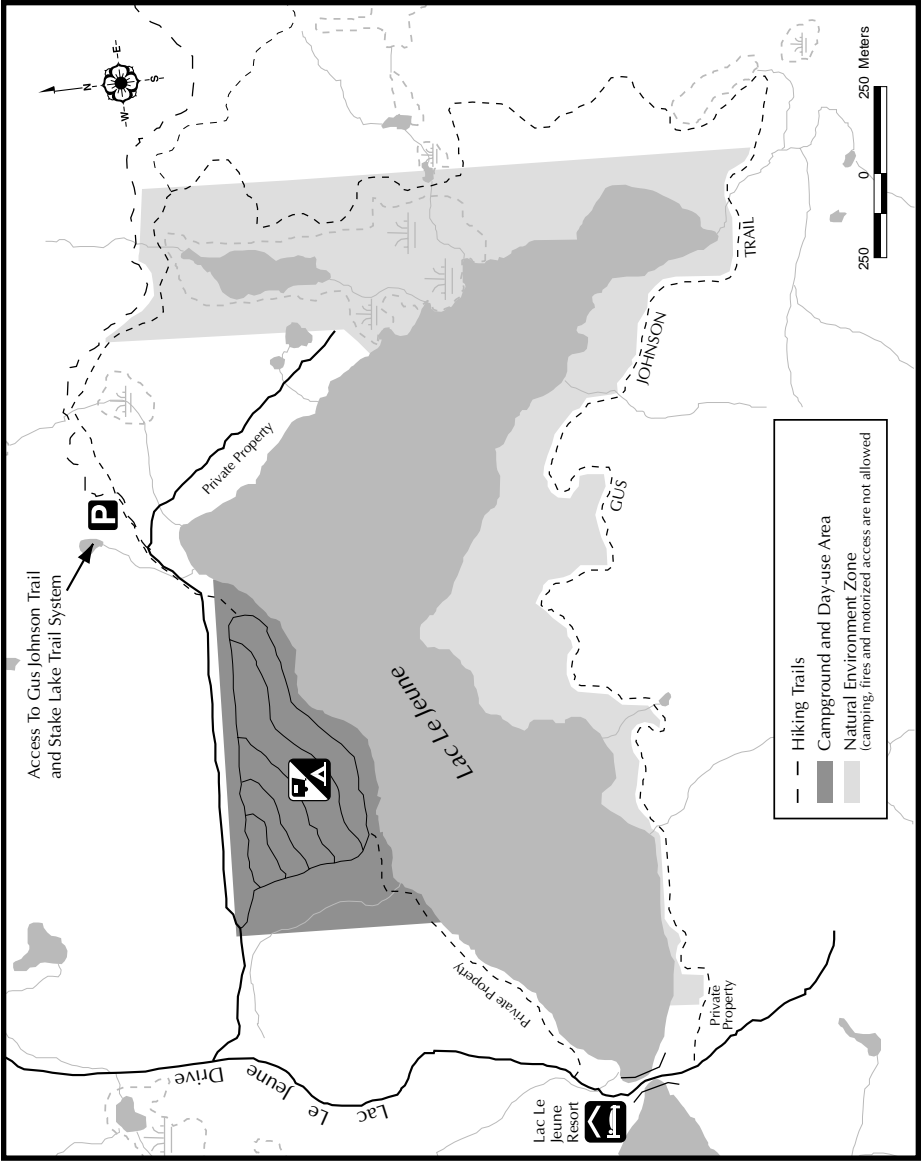
