

## Conservation

Flowers, trees, shrubs, shells and even rocks are part of the park's natural heritage. Please do not damage or remove them.

## Wildlife

Park users should always be aware of bears and other wildlife. Never feed or approach them.

## Park Fees

**Open all year.** Fees are collected for services from April to October. There is a winter fee (with no services provided) charged from November to March. Campers must be self-sufficient. Season dates and fees are subject to change – please check the website for current information.

**Check-in:** 1 p.m. for reservation holders; 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. for non-reservation holders. **Check-out:** 11 a.m. **Gates open** at 7 a.m. and **close** at 11 p.m.

Little Qualicum is very busy on weekends throughout the summer months.

## What You Should Know



There are 94 campsites at this park.

Campsite reservations are accepted and first-come, first-served sites are also available. For reservations call 1-800-689-9025 or [www.discovercamping.ca](http://www.discovercamping.ca). Maximum stay is 14 days. No electrical hookups are available.



There is a day-use/picnicking area with picnic tables, picnic shelter, flush toilets and parking area. Picnicking in campsites is not permitted.



There is 1 campsite, a flush toilet building and some pit toilets in the park that are wheelchair accessible. Contact the Regional Office for more information.



Cold water taps are located throughout the park. Taps are shut off during the off season.



Pit toilets are available in this park. Flush toilets are available from April 15 to October 15.



There are no shower facilities at this park.



There are no sani-station/dump facilities at this park. The closest station is located at Rathtrevor Beach Park, 3 kilometres south of Parksville. There is a charge for dumping. Direct discharge onto ground is not permitted.



Firewood may be available for purchase. Campfire pits are provided. Group campfire facilities and/or limited burning hours may be designated at some campgrounds. Fire bans may be implemented during extremely hot weather conditions. Be prepared to bring a portable stove for cooking.



There are 6 kilometres of walking trails throughout the park with a loop trail viewing the lower and upper waterfalls. For your own safety and preservation of the park, obey posted signs and keep to designated trails. Shortcutting trails destroys plant life and soil structure.



There is an adventure playground available at this park.



There is river fishing but closures are posted in the park. All anglers must have a valid fishing license; refer to current *BC Environment Fishing Regulations Synopsis*.



Bicycles must keep to roadways. No cycling on trails.



Pets/domestic animals must be on a leash at all times and are not allowed in beach areas or park buildings. You are responsible for their behavior and must dispose of their excrement.

## Special Notes

Please take valuables with you when leaving your vehicle or lock them in a secure location when leaving your campsite. All losses should be reported to the RCMP and park staff.

Riverbanks can be very slippery. Stay away from cliff and riverbank edges. Sections of this river contain waterfalls, strong currents and other hazards. Boating is not recommended. Jumping from bridges or cliffs is prohibited.

The nearest public telephone is located at the Fair Deal Tire on Hwy 4 on the way to Parksville.

Alcohol consumption is permitted only within the boundaries of campsites with registered occupants of legal age. Excessive noise, loud music, alcohol and parties are prohibited in the day-use area and campground.

The river is closed to swimming from the upper bridge down to the park boundary (see map). For safety reasons, swimming is not recommended in any of the other river pools. Those wanting to swim should try our Cameron Lake day-use area located 10 minutes west on the highway.

# Little Qualicum Falls

## PROVINCIAL PARK



Welcome to Little Qualicum Falls Provincial Park. Located 19 kilometres west of Parksville off Hwy 4, this 440-hectare park straddles Little Qualicum River where impressive waterfalls crash and plummet down a rocky gorge in a forest setting. Shaded riverside trails and picnic facilities along Cameron Lake make Little Qualicum a favoured destination. To the west is world-renowned Cathedral Grove in MacMillan Provincial Park, the gateway to the Alberni Valley and the open coast beaches of Pacific Rim National Park. To the east are the sunny, sandy beaches of the Parksville-Qualicum area.
