



MOUNT SEYMOUR PROVINCIAL PARK FALL TRAIL REPORT

October 23rd, 2009

Sunrise: 7:46 am

Sunset: 6:07 pm

Attention Visitors: Rain events from last fall have destroyed a number of bridges on Perimeter/Upper Old Buck Trails in close proximity to Deep Cove Lookout. **The trails are impassable at these locations.**

HIKING TRAILS:

Multi-Use Trails

Lower Old Buck Trail: This trail is heavily used by mountain bikes. Trail is in good condition.

Baden Powell: Trail is in good condition.

Empress Bypass Trail: This trail is heavily used by mountain bikes and is maintained by the North Shore Mountain Bike Association. Trail is in good condition.

Hiking Trails

Upper Old Buck: There are two bridges out on this trail. Creek crossings at damaged bridges are difficult at best of times and impossible during periods of heavy rain.

Cabin Trail: A few muddy patches on the trail.

Perimeter Trail: Trail is in good condition.

Goldie/Flower Lake: Trails are clear with a few muddy sections.

Mystery Lake: Trail is clear with a few muddy sections.

Dog Mt./First Lake: Trails are clear.

Mt. Seymour Main Trail: Trail is clear and in good condition. Please use caution beyond Second Peak.

Elsay Lake Trail: Trail is clear and in good condition. Please do not underestimate the difficulty of this hike. Special thanks to the Vancouver Korean Hiking Club for over 100 person-days conducting volunteer trail work this summer and fall.

Daylight hours are decreasing rapidly.

Daylight Saving Time ends November 1st - sunset occurs one hour earlier.
