Winter Trails

MOUNT SEYMOUR MAIN TRAIL (8 KM RETURN): The trailhead is located at the BC Parks information kiosk at the end of the upper parking lot. The trail is marked with orange-tipped bamboo poles to an "End of Marked Access" sign at Elsay Turnoff.

FIRST LAKE TRAIL (2.5 KM RETURN): The trailhead is located at the BC Parks information kiosk. The trail is marked with orange-tipped bamboo poles to First Lake, and loops back to the Seymour Main Trail approximately 500m from the parking lot.

Multi-Use Trails

LOWER OLD BUCK TRAIL: Snow patches remain on trail. It may be difficult to follow.

BADEN POWELL TRAIL: Snow patches remain on trail. It may be difficult to follow.

EMPRESS BYPASS TRAIL: Snow patches remain on trail. It may be difficult to follow.

Hiking Trails

UPPER OLD BUCK TRAIL: The trail is snow-covered and may be difficult to follow.

PERIMETER TRAIL: Rain events have destroyed a number of bridges along this trail. The Trail is currently closed.

GOLDIE/FLOWER LAKE TRAILS: Trails are snow-covered and within Mount Seymour Resorts controlled recreation area. Call Mount Seymour Resorts at 604-986-2261 for more information.

MYSTERY LAKE TRAIL: Trail is within Mount Seymour Resorts ski area and is closed for the winter.

DOG MOUNTAIN TRAIL: Trail is snow-covered and not marked in winter.

ELSAY LAKE TRAIL: Trail is snow covered- **CLOSED** for the winter. Extreme hazard.
