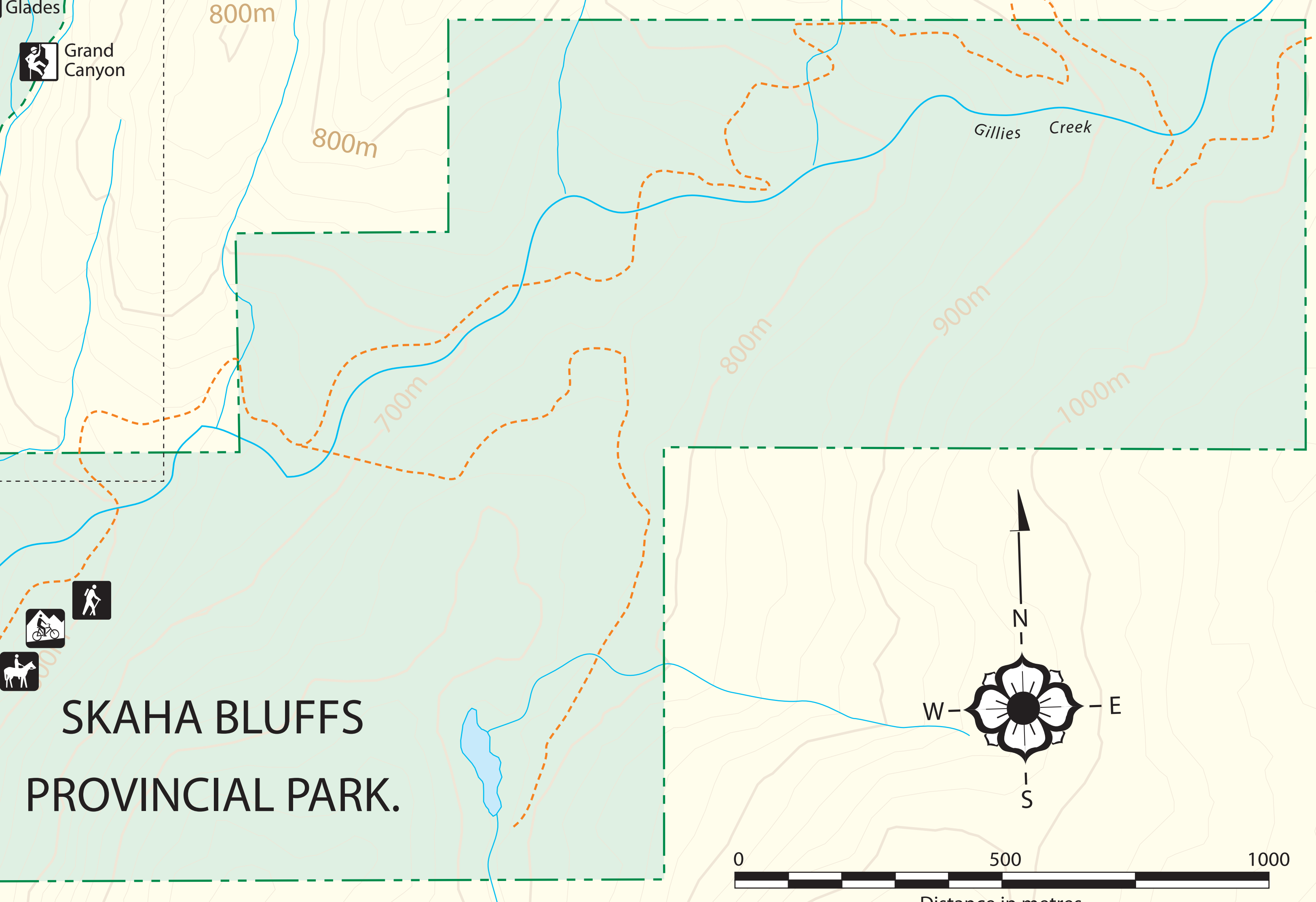
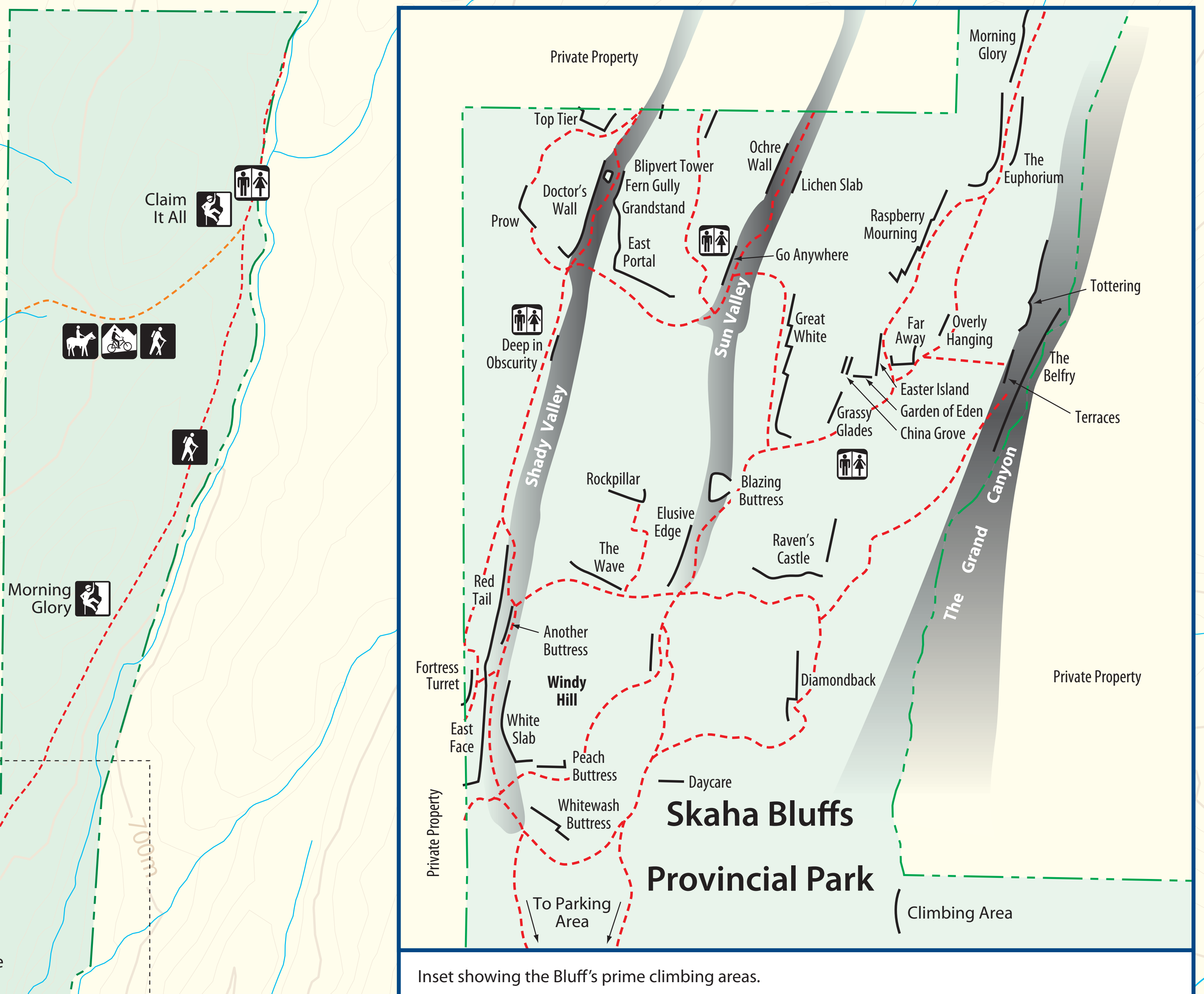
CAUTION

Grasslands are a Rich but Vulnerable Landscape.

On the eastern slopes of Skaha Lake, rolling hills of bunchgrass, sparse Ponderosa pine forests and rugged rocky outcroppings offer a refuge for an abundance of plants and animals. Some of Skaha's rare species include Bighorn sheep, Night snake, rattlesnake, Western screech owl and Spotted bat.
