



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Mount Elphinstone Provincial Park Purpose Statement and Zoning Plan

Primary Role

The **primary role** of Mount Elphinstone Provincial Park is to protect a mixed old growth and second growth forest and the very diverse and rich fungi populations associated with the forest. The park protects a relatively undisturbed lower elevation forest in three separate sites and provides the biogeoclimatic conditions appropriate for extensive fungi populations.

Secondary Role

The **secondary role** is to provide local and regional recreation opportunities for fungi interpretation and viewing, hiking and mountain biking.

Known Management Issues	Response
The boundary of Site 2 of the park was incorrectly identified during the designation process and needs to be readjusted.	Environmental Stewardship is now discussing a boundary adjustment with Ministry of Forests and will work towards a legislative change.
All three of the park sites are relatively small and could be impacted by adjacent development or forestry activities.	Work with adjacent management agencies and land owners to protect park values.
Unauthorized trail developments could negatively impact natural values in the park.	Ensure local community and organizations are aware of park boundaries and mandate, work with local groups to prevent unauthorized developments.

Zoning

Natural Environment - The entire park is zoned Natural Environment to allow protection of the forest and fungi values while continuing to allow mountain biking and hiking activities and associated trail facilities.

Conservation

- Representation - ecosection Minor contributor to the under represented Georgia Lowland (GEL) Ecosection (8.44%).
- biogeoclimatic subzone/variant Negligible contribution to the under-represented CWHdm (5.89% protected).
- Special Feature
- Rare/Endangered Values Fungi populations.
- Scientific/Research Opportunities Fungi populations.




Zoning Map - Mount Elphinstone Provincial Park
