## LIMITED USE AGREEMENT FOR DIGITAL DATA

---

**By downloading or requesting CDC Data, you agree to the following terms and conditions with regard to the use of digital data from the British Columbia Conservation Data Centre (BC CDC).**

1. You are free to make copies of BC CDC data in digital or hard copy form for use or distribution within your department, agency, business or corporation. Subcontractors may have access to these data during the course of any given project but should not be given a copy for their use on subsequent unrelated work. Beyond these limits, BC CDC data may not be further distributed or sold in any format. Should you be approached by individuals outside your organization for the type of data that we provide, please refer them to the BC CDC.
2. As a professional courtesy, we ask that you acknowledge the BC CDC as a source of your information whenever you use BC CDC data in your reports, papers, publications or in maps that incorporate BC CDC graphic elements. We prefer to be cited as: Conservation Data Centre, Ecosystem Branch, Ministry of Environment, Victoria BC.
3. You must recognize that our database is dynamic. We add, delete and change records on a regular basis. Consequently, we strongly advise that you plan to update your BC CDC data sets about every six months. It is your responsibility to use a current copy of BC CDC data for your analysis or other work.
4. BC CDC data require a certain degree of biological expertise for proper analysis, interpretation and application. Our staff are available to you by phone to advise you about the technical aspects of our data. It is your responsibility to insure that the data you obtain from us are not misapplied.
5. We work very hard to keep the BC CDC database as current and up to date as possible given our capabilities and resources. However, the BC CDC database should not be considered as an exhaustive and comprehensive inventory of rare species and ecological communities. Field verification for the absence and presence of sensitive species will always be an important obligation of our clients. Likewise, your contribution of data to the BC CDC is equally important to the maintenance of our database. Field observation forms for plants, animals and plant communities may be obtained from our web site, completed, and returned to this office. We are interested not only in new occurrences, but any information you may have about changed circumstances of existing occurrences.
