

INSTRUCTIONS

1. DATE – fill in date once for each day fished, using month/day/year format.
2. RIVER OR LAKE – record the name(s) of river(s) or lake(s) fished on each date. If you fish more than one river or lake on a given date, note the names of each water on SEPARATE LINES. For any river that has multiple zones, you are required to specify the zone in which you fished. Treat each of these zones as if they were separate rivers.
For example: Skeena River has 4 zones, Skeena 1, Skeena 2, Skeena 3 and Skeena 4.
3. ANGLER DAYS – an “angler day” is defined as one angler fishing any part of a day on one lake or river. To complete this section, record the number of guests that fished each river or lake noted for that date. If one of your clients is guided on more than one lake or river on a given date, one angler day should be recorded for EACH location fished by that person. Residence categories are:

NR = Non-residents of Canada

RC = Residents of Canada from provinces other than B.C.

BC = B.C. residents

4. CATCH – for each river or lake fished on any given day, note the species caught and the numbers killed (K), released (R), and the total catch (TOT). Species abbreviations are:

AC = Arctic Char

AG = Arctic Grayling

BB = Burbot

BCB = Black Crappie

BT = Bull Trout

CH = Chinook

CO = Coho

CP = Carp

CT = Cutthroat

DV = Dolly Varden

EB = Eastern Brook Trout

GB = Brown Trout

KO = Kokanee

LMB = Largemouth Bass

LT = Lake Trout

LW = Lake Whitefish

MW = Mountain Whitefish

NP = Northern Pike

PK = Pink

PMB = Pumpkinseed Sunfish

RB = Rainbow Trout

SK = Sockeye

SMB = Smallmouth Bass

ST = Steelhead

WP = Walleye

WSG = White Sturgeon

YP = Yellow Perch
