High Streamflow Advisory Ended – Salloomt River

BC Environment has ended the **High Streamflow Advisory** for the Central Coast initially issued on Friday 27Oct2006, specifically:

- Salloomt River at Hagensborg
- Other small and mid-sized Central Coast rivers

The intense Pacific frontal system that produced the heavy rainfall throughout the Central Coast since last Wednesday ended on Sunday. No significant precipitation is forecast for the next 48 to 72 hours and water levels in mid-sized rivers in the region will continue receding.

A **High Streamflow Advisory** means that river levels are rising or expected to rise rapidly, but that no major flooding is expected. Minor flooding in low-lying areas is possible.

A **Flood Watch** means that river levels are rising and will approach or may exceed bankfull. Flooding of areas adjacent to affected rivers may occur.

A **Flood Warning** means that river levels have exceeded bankfull or will exceed bankfull imminently, and that flooding of areas adjacent to the rivers affected will result.
