#### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

The information in this booklet is a summary of the regulations, which apply to Limited Entry Hunts. Applicants who are successful in the draw are required to refer to the 2002/2003 Hunting and Trapping Regulations Synopsis, available in July, for those 'General' hunting regulations affecting their Limited Entry Hunts.

The purpose of Limited Entry Hunting is to achieve wildlife management objectives without

resorting to such measures as shortening seasons or completely closing areas. It is only introduced where it has become necessary to limit the number of hunters, limit the number of animals that may be taken, or limit the harvest to a certain 'Class' of animal.

Although, in some instances, 'General' open seasons may precede or coincide with Limited Entry Hunts, for the same species and in the same area, the 'Class' of animal available during the 'General' open season will generally be different from the 'Class' of animal available during the Limited Entry Hunting seasons.

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

# Any resident who is eligible to hunt in BC (holds a Resident Hunter Number in good standing) may apply.

Resident means I) a person who is a Canadian citizen or a permanent resident of Canada, whose only or primary residence is in British Columbia, and has resided in British Columbia for 7 months in the 12 months immediately before making an application under the Wildlife Act or the regulations or doing another thing relevant to the operation of the Wildlife Act, or 2) a person who is not a Canadian citizen or a permanent resident of Canada, but whose only or primary residence is in British Columbia, and has resided in British Columbia for the 12 month period immediately before making an application under the Wildlife Act or the regulations or doing another thing relevant to the operation of the Wildlife Act.

Information on how to obtain a B.C. Resident Hunter Number Card is available from any Government Agent's office. Licenced junior hunters are permitted to accompany and hunt with an adult holder of a valid limited entry hunting authorization and a valid species licence. Any big game animal killed by the junior hunter is counted as the bag limit of the supervising adult.

A resident may not apply for a limited entry hunting authorization while the resident is ineligible to obtain a hunting licence. This could occur if the residents' hunting licence or hunter number has been suspended, cancelled or the resident has unpaid fines under the Wildlife Act or Firearm Act. Applications made by a person when ineligible will not be entered in the draw and NO refund will be issued.

#### LIMITED ENTRY HUNTING 'AUTHORIZATIONS'

There is no fee for a Limited Entry Hunting Authorization. Authorizations, once issued, cannot be transferred to another person — please do not phone or return them requesting this be done. A person may submit ONLY ONE APPLICATION CARD for the SAME SPECIES, (except for Special Sheep Draw see page 4) i.e. I card for a Moose, I card for an Elk, etc.

#### NOTICE TO FIRST NATION APPLICANTS

The first priority of the Ministry of Water, Land and Air Protection is to ensure the long-term conservation of wildlife populations and their habitats. The Ministry also recognizes that in some circumstances Native people have legal aboriginal rights to harvest wildlife for sustenance (food, social and ceremonial purposes) in their traditional areas. Such uses of wildlife must be sustainable, and harvesting methods must not jeopardize public safety or the use and enjoyment of property. Any hunting of wildlife species for sale or barter, in whole or in part, is not legal, except as authorized by regulation or where there is a demonstrable aboriginal or treaty right to do so.

Under the Wildlife Act, 'Indian' means a person who is defined as a status Indian under the Indian Act (Canada).

Indians who are residents of British Columbia are not required to obtain any type of hunting licence under the Wildlife Act. Indians who are residents of B.C. and are exercising their aboriginal right to hunt for sustenance purposes in their traditional territory may be required to comply with hunting regulations which includes the requirement for Limited Entry Hunting (LEH) authorizations. Where compliance with hunting regulations is required by Indians belonging to a First Nation group, there will be prior consultation with the affected First Nation in accordance with Ministry policy and procedures. Prior to undertaking any hunting activity, individuals should inquire with their appropriate First Nation officials or with the Regional Fish & Wildlife Manager with respect to any specific requirement that may apply to them.

Indians who are residents of B.C. and wish to hunt outside their traditional territory must do so in accordance with the Hunting Regulations, This includes submitting applications for a LEH authorization via the LEH draw. When completing their application card(s), "INDIAN' should be entered in the space allotted for Resident Hunter Number. This is required as a means of identification to prevent computer rejection of an incomplete application card. Indian applicants must enter their complete mailing address including the postal code on the application card. Indians who are successful in the draw must comply with the requirements of Compulsory Reporting/Inspection or any other Hunting Regulations. For further information, contact the Fish and Wildlife Recreation and Allocation Branch.

#### PRIVATE LAND

Please remember that it is illegal to hunt on private land without the consent of the owner. Indian Reserves are private land. Permission must be obtained from the local Indian Business office in order to hunt on or across these lands.

#### SUCCESSFUL APPLICANTS

This is a reminder that although you have been drawn for a Limited Entry Hunting Authorization, you are still required to possess and carry your valid B.C. Resident Hunting Licence and the appropriate valid B.C. Species Licence(s) while hunting under authority of a Limited Entry Hunting Authorization.

Each year, the Fish and Wildlife Recreation and Allocation Branch sends questionnaires to a random sample of hunters requesting information about their hunting activities. The information provided by hunters who complete and return these questionnaires is vital to the management of hunting in B.C. All hunters who draw a Limited Entry Authorization to hunt bison, elk, moose, mule deer and white-tailed deer will be sent questionnaires. These questionnaires may also ask them to provide information related to their hunting during regular open seasons. Hunters are urged to promptly complete and return any questionnaires they receive. Contact Biometrician, Fish and Wildlife Recreation and Allocation Branch, Victoria.

#### SPECIES

The term 'Species' as used in this booklet refers to the type of game animal, e.g. Moose, Elk, Caribou, etc. When a species name is used, e.g. 'Moose', this means ALL MOOSE regardless of whether they are bulls, cows or calves — they all belong to the species 'Moose'.

This explanation is given for those applicants who have been under the wrong impression in thinking that if they were to apply for a bull moose hunt and an antierless moose hunt on the same application, they would be applying for two different species.

The ten species of game animal available under Limited Entry Hunting are: CARIBOU, ELK, MOOSE, MOUNTAIN GOAT, MOUNTAIN SHEER MULE (Black-tailed) DEER, WHITE-TAILED DEER, TURKEY, GRIZZLY BEAR and BISON.

Note: Mule (Black-tailed) Deer, White-tailed Deer are two separate species.

DO NOT ENTER HUNT CODES ON THE SAME APPLICATION CARD FOR DIFFERENT SPECIES, e.g. "MOOSE & ELK", "MULE DEER & WHITE-TAILED DEER", etc. IF TWO SPECIES ARE SUBMITTED ON ONE APPLICATION, THE SECOND CHOICE WILL BE DISOALIFIED.

#### **BAG LIMIT**

A Limited Entry Hunting 'Authorization' does not permit a person to exceed the 'Regular' hunting season bag limit of any species of game. Provincial and Regional bag limits still apply, as shown in the 2002/2003 Hunting and Trapping Regulations Synopsis. Please note that any big game animal taken by a licenced junior hunter is counted to the bag limit of the accompanying adult holder of a Limited

General Requirements

- It is mandatory for elk in Regions 2 & 8, and all mountain sheep, mountain goat, caribou, grizzly bear and harvested to be inspected. Designated Compulsory Inspection centres and the portions of these animals that are required are listed in the current Hunting & Trapping Regulations Synopsis.
- Please refer to the current Hunting and Trapping Regulations Synopsis for the following information which may apply to Limited Entry Hunts:
- No Shooting and No Hunting Areas Special Closed Areas Wildlife Sanctuaries
- Drawings and detailed descriptions of antler and horn restrictions
- Anyone who kills a bull elk or a bull moose under the authority of a Limited Entry Hunting Authorization must, while returning from the hunt, keep the antlers of the animal available for inspection by an officer.

#### **LIMITED ENTRY HUNTING SYNOPSIS 2002/2003**

#### COMPLETION OF APPLICATION CARDS

Please use a pen or typewriter to make the entries on your card. PRINT your name CLEARLY in CAPITAL LETTERS and commence with your 'Last Name' in the first box at the top left of the card.

When entering your address, be sure it is your COMPLETE MAILING ADDRESS, not merely the postal code or box number. Do not enter your home address unless you have home delivery of mail.

Each application card presents an opportunity for the applicant to make TWO SPECIFIC HUNIT CHOICES for one species only. Applicants MUST complete the FIRST CHOICE boxes – the second choice is optional.

PLEASE DO NOT USE 'LIQUID WHITENERS' to make any alterations on application cards as they do not completely dry to a hard surface and may cause an application card to adhere to another card. This could result in the altered application card being missed during processing. PRINT CORRECTIONS ABOVE THE INCORRECT ENTRY.

An incorrect, incomplete or illegible application may not be accepted for the draw.

#### MAILING INSTRUCTIONS

For persons sending only ONE APPLICATION:

- DO NOT enclose your card in an envelope it has been designed as a Post Card for ease of handling in Victoria.
- 2. Place sufficient postage on your card.
- Remove the 'Group Hunt' section of the card before mailing – tear off at the perforation line indicated by the arrows.

For persons sending MORE THAN ONE APPLICATION:

- You may send your applications enclosed in an envelope.
   DO NOT STAPLE, PIN or TAPE your cards together.
- 3. DO NOT SEND MONEY, LICENCES, ETC., with your

- Remove the 'Group Hunt' section of the card before mailing – tear off at the perforation line indicated by the arrows

For persons applying for a 'GROUP HUNT' or a 'SHARED HUNT':

#### TO APPLY

- 1. You may submit only 1 application for each species you are applying for (except for Special Sheep Draw, see page 4). (For example, White-tailed deer and Mule deer are two separate species and would require two separate application cards.) Where an applicant lists 2 species on a single application card, the second species choice will automatically be deleted.
- 2. Be sure to enter your correct B.C. Resident Hunter Number on your application card.
- Enter your name and full mailing address. An incomplete or incorrect mailing address may result in your draw notification being undeliverable.
- Carefully enter the hunt code numbers in the first choice and second choice boxes on the application. Do not enter management unit (M.U.) numbers or class of animal in these boxes.
- 5. Persons applying for group hunts must submit applications together in the same envelope.

#### APPLICATION CARDS

Application cards may be obtained in person from any issuer of hunting licences. They may also be obtained, by mail, from any Government Office that issues resident hunting licences.

# ONLY OFFICIAL APPLICATION CARDS ARE ACCEPTABLE. NO FACSIMILES WILL BE ACCEPTED.

The fee for an Application Card is \$5.00 - this fee is NOT REFUNDABLE.

APPLICATIONS MUST BE RECEIVED IN VICTORIA BY 4:30 pm JUNE 12, 2002. Proof of postage, i.e. postmarks, cannot be taken into consideration for late arrivals.

TRY TO MAIL YOUR APPLICATIONS AS EARLY AS POSSIBLE –DO NOT LEAVE THEM UNTIL THE LAST MINUTE.

#### **CONDITIONS OF APPLICATION**

A person is restricted to submitting no more than ten application cards (except for special sheep draw see page 4), i.e. I card for each of the ten species of game available under Limited Entry.

For further clarification — there are, for example, several classes of the species ELK, i.e. Antlered, Antlerless, Calf, etc. It is incorrect to send one application card for an Antlered Elk Hunt, another for an Antlerless Elk Hunt and yet another card for a Calf Elk Hunt. You may only submit one application card for an Elk hunt regardless of the type (Class) of Elk or the location of the hunt.

To avoid disqualification of applications for a species, a person may only submit one application for hunts of that species in one calendar year.

#### NOTIFICATION OF APPLICANTS

After the completion of the draw, the computer prints on special forms all the LEH authorizations that were assigned. These authorizations will contain the applicant's name, address, Hunter Number, and the Limited Entry Hunt assigned, with species, type and dates. Also printed on the authorizations are any special hunt conditions that must be followed. These authorizations are immediately mailed to the applicants. In some cases, special instructions or requests for information from the hunter, such as tooth return envelopes, may be included with the authorization at the time of mailing. Hunters who submit applications for more than one species, please note that your notification will include information about ALL of your applications and may contain BOTH Authorization(s) To Hunt and Unsuccessful Notice(s), depending upon your draw results. Please ensure you read the entire document you receive in the mail to avoid discarding a valid authorization in error.

After all of this effort, it is disappointing to have a number of LEH authorizations returned by the Post Office as undeliverable. This occurs because hunters who have moved have not informed the Fish and Wildlife Recreation and Allocation Branch of their new address, and have not left a forwarding address. Although Branch personnel make every effort to locate hunters, often these authorizations can only be placed in a special file waiting for inquiry from the hunter.

#### **EXPLANATION OF THE DRAW**

The Draw for all Limited Entry Hunting Authorizations will be made by a computer located in Victoria.

The allocation of authorizations for EACH SPECIES is determined by the following procedures, all of which are carried out by the computer:

- Each application is allotted a randomly selected unique number from a series ranging from 1 to 2,000,000,000.
- Applications are then arranged in their numerical order according to the randomly allotted number.
- The first application to be drawn is the one with the lowest number and an authorization is allotted to it according to the Hunt Code Number in its First Choice column.
- Applications continue to be selected in this manner, i.e., the lowest numbers first, until either:
- (a) all of the available authorizations have been allotted, or
- (b) all the applications FIRST CHOICES have been checked yet there still remain additional authorizations to be allotted.
- If all the authorizations have not been allotted by checking all the FIRST CHOICES then the same procedure is repeated using the SECOND CHOICES.
   In the case of Grizzly Bears only, after all the SECOND
- 6. In the case of Grizzly Bears only, after all the SECOND CHOICES have been checked and there still remains unallotted Authorizations the same procedure is repeated once again, this time selecting those applications for Grizzly Bear checked (\*/) as "YES" agreeing to accept a "Substitute" hunt. These hunts may not be for the M.U. applied for, but will be for the region.

Over the years, many unsuccessful Limited Entry applicants have suggested that the draw should be changed to increase the chances of those who were previously not drawn. In 1993, a new 'enhanced odds' system was introduced, on a trial basis, for elk in the Kootenays (Region 4). The new system reduced (by up to 50%) the likelihood of being drawn for elk anywhere in Region 4 if the applicant was drawn for elk anywhere in Region 4 in the previous year. Thus by reducing the chances of being drawn for previously successful applicants, this system improved the odds for those who were unsuccessful. Analysis of draw results showed that the system worked as it was intended to, with repeat success for cow/calf elk reduced to well below 1%. It is important to note that previously successful people could still be drawn, but their chances were reduced.

In 1998, the 'enhanced odds' system was put into place for all species and regions, except for mule deer and white-tailed deer

Under this system, the degree to which previously successful applicants have their chances reduced is dependent on demand. If the number of people who apply for a hunt is more than twice the number of available authorizations, then previously successful applicants will have their chances reduced by 50%. If the demand for a hunt is less than twice the number of available authorizations then previously successful applicants will still have their chances reduced, but the reduction will be somewhat less than 50%. If the demand for a hunt is so low that there are fewer applicants than available authorizations, then previously successful applicants will not have their chances reduced at all. Hunters should be aware that any hunt they drew last year (except for mule deer and white-tailed deer) may affect their odds in this 2002 Limited Entry Draw. Similarly, any hunt they draw this year may affect their odds if they apply in the 2003 Limited Entry Draw.

Hunters please note! The following changes to "enhanced odds" will be implemented in 2002 (this year):

- (1) All hunters drawn in 2001 for any species except mule (black-tailed) deer and white-tailed deer will have their odds reduced in 2002 if they apply for the same species again, regardless of region of hunt (previously the odds were affected only if the application was made for the same species in the same region).
- (2) All hunters drawn in 2001 for moose will now be under an "enhanced odds" process that will affect their odds for the next 3 year's moose LEH draws (<u>previously</u> the odds were affected for the next 1 year's moose LEH draw). See the description of "enhanced odds" in this synopsis.

At the conclusion of the Draw, ALL APPLICANTS, both successful and unsuccessful, will be notified of their Draw results by mail. This notification should be received by July 11, 2002.

Please do not telephone for draw results before this date unless you have applied for a hunt that starts in August.

#### SUBSTITUTE HUNTS

Occasionally, some Grizzly Bear hunts have so few applicants that there are hunting opportunities that have not been assigned after all first and second choice applications have been processed. Any such left over hunts will be assigned to applicants who mark the 'YES' box in the section of their application that asks if they are willing to accept a substitute hunt. This area of the application is situated just below where the first and second choice are entered. After all first and second choices have been assigned; any remaining opportunities will be issued to those who indicated they would accept a substitute hunt. All substitute hunts will be assigned in the region of the applicant's second choice. Please note that if you choose this option, you could be issued an authorization for a Limited Entry Grizzly Bear hunt in a location that is far away from the vicinity of either your first or second choice.

Most Limited Entry application forms will have the section offering substitute hunts; however, some older application forms that do not display this option may still be in circulation. If you purchase an application that does not offer this option, and you wish to be eligible for a substitute hunt, please write 'I WILL ACCEPT A SUBSTITUTE HUNT' in the area immediately below the section where you entered your first and second choice hunt codes.

Please note, substitute hunts are only issued for Grizzly Bear hunts and are not offered in any other draws for any other species.

#### **GROUP HUNTS**

In order to accommodate those hunters who prefer to hunt with their friends rather than on their own, a method known as 'Group Hunt' was devised so they could combine their applications and have them entered in the draw as 'ONE' application. If this 'ONE' application is drawn, then each hunter within the 'Group' would receive an authorization. Group hunt applications will not be accepted for bison.

Persons applying as a 'Group' should, of course, only apply for those hunts that have sufficient authorizations to allow for each applicant in the 'Group' to receive an authorization. Group applicants should be aware that the 'tentative number of authorizations available' listed for each hunt may vary and could be reduced at the draw date to a number lower than the number of hunters applying as a group. When the number of available authorizations are fewer than the number of applicants for a group hunt, the group membership will be ignored and each member will be entered in the draw as an individual. Changes to the number of available authorizations may be made to any Limited Entry hunt, but most likely for Grizzly Bear hunts.

A 'Group Hunt' may not consist of more than FOUR persons. When submitting 'Group Hunt' application cards, ALL the cards of the 'Group' must be submitted TOGETHER IN ONE AND THE SAME ENVELOPE and the words 'GROUP HUNT' must be clearly printed on the bottom left corner on the FRONT of the envelope. This 'GROUP HUNT' marking assists in sorting the thousands of envelopes we receive.

'Group Hunt' applications, which are not enclosed together in a single envelope but are sent as post cards will be accepted as 'Single Hunt' applications.

NOTE: should one hunter within a group hunt have been successful drawing a LEH authorization in the previous year for a species to which the enhanced odds system applies, the odds of the entire group will be reduced if they apply in the same region for the same species.

When completing the 'GROUP HUNT' section of the application cards, be sure to enter the APPLICATION CARD SERIAL NUMBERS in the boxes numbered 1, 2 and 3 – DO NOT enter your Hunter Numbers here.

The HUNT CODE NUMBERS entered in the FIRST and SECOND CHOICE boxes must be exactly the same on EACH CARD in the 'Group.'

Applications that are not identical in these respects may result in their separation and entry as individual applications instead of a 'Group Hunt'. All 'required' entries MUST be entered onto the application in order for it to be accepted as a 'Group' entry.

#### WARNING:

Group hunt applications are discouraged for hunts where the tentative number of authorizations available is 4 or less. In some cases, the final number of authorizations may be decreased to fewer than the number of persons in the group applying. In such cases, it is impossible for the group to be selected.

#### LIMITED ENTRY SHARED HUNTS

Last year, in response to hunter demand, a new type of Limited Entry hunt was introduced for moose in Region 3 only. The purpose of this new idea is to increase the number of hunters who are drawn in the Limited Entry draw without having to increase the number of moose that may be harvested. These Limited Entry Shared Moose hunts will be offered again this year. For a specially marked group of bull moose hunts in Region 3 (Thompson Region see page 7), group applications will be handled in a different manner. For these hunts, applicants may apply as groups of two, three or four. If they are drawn, a group of two will be allowed to take one moose only, and a group of three or four will be allowed to take two moose only. All group members participating in the hunt must be able to communicate with one another in order to ensure that any kill is immediately recorded on each group member's authorization, in conjunction with the immediate canceling of the species licence of the hunter making the kill. Electronic communication may be used to aid in recording the kill.

Those who apply for these special Limited Entry Shared Hunts will have an advantage in the draw over a single applicant. The applications for each member of the group will enter the draw as single applications, but if any member of the group is drawn, then the entire group will be drawn. If a group of four hunters applies for one of these hunts, their four applications will enter the draw. As soon as any one of them is drawn, they are all automatically drawn, therefore a group of four applicants has four chances to be drawn. This

differs from the way group applications for other hunts are handled. For all hunts other than the special Limited Entry Shared Hunts, a group application enters the draw as a single application, and therefore a group has only one chance to be drawn.

A successful group application by four hunters will result in each group member receiving a Limited Entry Shared Hunt authorization that allows the group to take a maximum of two moose. Each group member must also have a valid moose species licence. Any group member can take a moose in the area and season covered by the Limited Entry Shared Hunt, but no individual in the group may take more than one moose and each hunter in the group must cease moose hunting when his or her species licence is cancelled. When the group has reached its limit of two moose, each group member must stop hunting in their Limited Entry Shared Hunt.

When your group harvests a moose, the group member that killed the moose must immediately cancel their moose species licence and the harvest details must immediately be recorded in the Harvest Details section of each group member's authorization. The total number of moose your group may harvest will be listed at the top of each group member's authorization. Hunters must record the harvest details for each moose taken in the Limited Entry Shared hunt in the Harvest Details section of each group member's authorization. Do not exceed your group's limit! The annual moose bag limit for a hunter is one, therefore any group member who has already taken a moose in any type of moose hunting season during the same licence year may not participate in a Limited Entry Shared Hunt.

If one or more members of your Limited Entry Shared hunting group cannot participate, the other group members may still hunt. Those group members who do participate in a Limited Entry Shared hunt must not exceed their own bag limit or the group's bag limit. If a group member that has not been participating in the hunt decides to rejoin the group and partake in the hunt, they must make sure that the Harvest Details section of their Limited Entry Shared hunt authorization is up to date before they begin to hunt.

Limited Entry Shared Hunts are being offered on an experimental basis. If they prove to be popular and do not cause serious difficulties, they may be expanded to other Limited Entry moose hunts in future years. The enhanced odds system, described in point 7 under EXPLANATION OF THE DRAW, applies to all moose hunts, so people who were previously drawn for moose will have their chances reduced. If any member of a group applying for these special Limited Entry Shared Hunts was drawn for moose last year then the entire group will have their odds reduced. If there is only one moose authorization left at the point a group of three or four is drawn for a Limited Entry Shared Hunt, then that group will only be permitted to take one moose.

If you wish to apply for one of these Limited Entry Shared Hunts, follow the same procedure as is described for Group Hunts, in the previous section. Be sure to submit all of the applications for your Limited Entry Shared Hunt together in the same envelope.



# SPECIAL MOUNTAIN SHEEP LIMITED ENTRY HUNT

The special mountain sheep limited entry hunt is available to resident hunters for the third time. At the time of the regular LEH draw, one special sheep application will be hand drawn from specially printed blue sheep applications to be received in Victoria by June 12, 2002. The special blue sheep applications are available from regular LEH application outlets for \$15.00 each with no limit to the number that may be purchased or submitted.

Again this year, one lucky special sheep hunt applicant will have the opportunity to hunt either a bighorn or thinhorn ram sheep in their region of choice during the open season and for a period of 30 days after it closes (dates for each region are listed below). If hunting for thinhorn ram sheep the successful applicant may hunt 21 days prior to the open season.

The special mountain sheep hunt allows the sheep to be taken in excess of the regular bag limit, however a second sheep species licence may not be purchased until after the first sheep species licence has been cancelled. If a sheep is harvested during the special hunt it will not be considered in the calculation of reduced odds for future LEH applications or considered in the limit of one sheep in three or five years in regions where that restriction applies. All other restrictions apply to the special hunt including those in the location of the open season for sheep relating to species, age, and sex. The successful hunter need not follow horn curl regulations that apply in the area hunted as the special limited entry mountain sheep permit will be for "any ram."

Ten dollars of the \$15 dollar application fee will go into the Wild Sheep Account within the Habitat Conservation Trust Fund (HCTF). A Project Review Committee has been established to fairly evaluate project applications to be funded by the Wild Sheep Account. Funded projects will be directed at improving wild sheep management, conservation and sheep habitat enhancement throughout British Columbia.

The special mountain sheep hunt is supported by the BC Wildlife Federation, the Wild Sheep Society of BC, the Guide Outfitters Association of BC and the Foundation for North American Wild Sheep. There is only one special resident LEH authorization for mountain sheep. The sheep authorization is not transferable. At present there are no plans for similar special hunts for other species.

#### Eligibility

Any resident who is eligible to hunt in BC (holds a Resident Hunter Number in good standing) may apply.


A resident who applies for the special sheep LEH may also apply for mountain sheep in the regular LEH draw.

A resident may apply as many times as he or she wishes for the special mountain sheep LEH.

#### Successful Applicant

The successful applicant for the special mountain sheep LEH must hold a valid Resident Hunting Licence and Mountain Sheep Species Licence while hunting The huntrer while hunting must also carry the Special Sheep LEH authorization. Please note that while the special mountain sheep LEH authorization allows the hunter to harvest 2 sheep in the licence year, the hunter CANNOT hold more than one uncancelled mountain sheep licence at any time.

All mountain sheep harvested in BC require Compulsory Inspection. Details on Compulsory Inspection may be found in the 2002/2003 Hunting Synopsis, available in early July.

#### LIMITED ENTRY HUNTING - TERMINOLOGY

SPECIES In this booklet 'species' refers to the following game animals: mountain goat, elk, moose, mountain sheep, caribou, mule (black-tailed) deer, white-tailed deer, turkey, grizzly bear and bison.

AREA

This term is used in conjunction with a place name to denote a specific land area within British Columbia. It can consist of a number of Management Units, a single Management Unit or a portion of a Management Unit. For instance, the ASH/NOLA AREA is comprised of a single Management Unit. 8-03. This particular area has also been subdivided into two Zones, A and B. Other examples are SPATSIZI PARK AREA which consists of only a portion of Management Units 6-19 and 6-20 and SMITHERS AREA which is comprised of several complete Management Units.

MANAGEMENT

A specific land area denoted by the initials 'M.U.' and a hyphenated number, i.e. M.U. 4-24, M.U.

UNITS (M.U.)

3-14, etc. If the Management Unit has been subdivided into Zones this will appear as M.U. 4-24A, M.U. 4-24B, etc.

SEASON DATES Refer to a period of time that hunting may take place. All dates are inclusive, e.g. September I to September 30 means that hunting may commence on September I and continue through to and include September 20

CLASS OF This term refers more specifically to the sex, age or antler/horn conformation of the animal for ANIMAL which an Authorization is available.

TENTATIVE The number which appears in the authorizations column is a tentative number only and may be AUTHORIZATIONS available authorizations. Generally, the change will be not more or less than 25% of the number AVAILABLE of authorizations shown.

Limited motorized access with snow machines likely being necessary for November and December but snow depths may vary greatly from year to year.

A bison species licence (fee \$ 70.00) will be available only by mail and only to those persons successfully drawn for a Limited Entry bison authorization.

Group hunt applications will not be accepted for bison. Any group applications that are received for bison will be entered as individual applications.

Hunters are prohibited from using a weapon other than:

a) a rifle that fires a 175 grain or larger bullet retaining 2712 joules (2000 foot pounds) or more energy at 100 metres, or

b) a bow having a pull greater than 22. 6 kg within the archer's draw length, an arrow greater than 26 grams in weight and a broadhead greater than 8.1 grams in weight and 2.2 cm in width at its widest point. Successful hunters are required to submit within 30 days of the kill, one of the incisor teeth (including the crown and root) of any bison taken to an officer or by mail in a Harvest Data Tooth Return Envelope. The following information must be supplied at the same time:

location of the kill • date of the kill • number of days hunted • sex of the animal taken.

Hunters are reminded that under Section 35 (2) of the Wildlife Act, anyone who kills or injures wildlife must make reasonable attempt to retrieve that wildlife, and if it is alive, to kill it. This is particularly important in bison.

#### **MOUNTAIN GOAT**

Due to concerns over the large percentage of female goats harvested in some areas of the Province, the Fish and Wildlife Recreation and Allocation Branch is continuing to encourage hunters to harvest male Mountain Goats only. This year, copies of a video titled "Is it a Billy or is it a Nanny" will be available for loan at regional wildlife offices to help hunters learn to select male Mountain Goats. Copies will also be available through the BC Wildlife Federation. Hunters are encouraged to borrow and view this video before their mountain goat hunt. Further restrictions, which could be implemented in 2003 may be avoided if hunters harvest male Mountain Goats only. Further details will be in the 2002/2003 Hunting and Trapping Regulation Synopsis.




Map 5i) Cariboo - Coastal Grizzly






MAP 6c) BULKLEY - TAHSTA GRIZZLY BEAR


