



Bird Checklist:

**Serpentine
Wildlife Area**

The Serpentine Wildlife Area (SWA), is 105 hectares in size, with approximately 80 hectares of dyked freshwater marsh and 4 hectares of undyked salt marsh. There is a public trail network along selected interior dykes and along the Serpentine-River dyke. There are three viewing towers, two of which are covered, providing visitors with excellent views of the upland agricultural, old-field, marsh and river habitats. SWA is managed by BC Environment.

This is a revised version of the SWA bird checklist originally compiled by **Jack Williams** and printed by the **White Rock and Surrey Naturalists (WRSN)** in 1983 with monies from the **Public Conservation Assistance Fund**. It has been reviewed, by birders familiar with the area, including **WRSN** members. It will be revised again as additional information is available. The following is a list of the 175 bird species which have been recorded at the Serpentine Wildlife Area and in the immediate, area. The status of each species is indicated by an abundance level in each of four seasons. The standard four letter code is shown for each species. Species known to have bred in this, area are denoted by an asterisk (*).

Explanation of Symbols:

- Sp Spring** March - May
- S Summer** June - August
- F Fall** September - November
- W Winter** December - February

- c Common:** easily observed on any visit to appropriate habitat in appropriate season
- f Frequent:** usually observed on any visit to appropriate habitat in appropriate season
- u Uncommon:** sometimes observed on a visit to appropriate habitat in appropriate -season
- r Rare:** only a few sightings each year
- ca Casual:** not recorded every year
- ac Accidental:** so far out of range that it is not likely to be seen, again

Other Wildlife:

SWA has good mammal viewing opportunities. Muskrats may be observed in the marshes year-round, especially from March through November. Eastern cottontails and coyotes may be seen throughout the year along the dykes and in the open fields. Harbour seals may be seen in the Serpentine River year-round.

Serpentine Wildlife Area Access:

Road access to the Serpentine Wildlife Area is from 40th Avenue, west off Highway 99A (King George Highway) just north of Highway 99. Many of the interior dykes are closed year-round to public access. Please respect no access signs. Dogs must be kept on leash at all times when visiting the area.

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
