This Present Land Use Map was prepared using 1977 air photographs and available B.C. Forest Service Forest Cover maps. The map indicates the location and extent of major land use. By up-dating this map periodically, planners can better determine land use changes over time.	
MAP SYMBOL B	 DESCRIPTION BUILT-UP AREAS. Land used for urban purposes including uses such as industrial sites, airstrips, logging and mining camps, etc.
K	 UNIMPROVED PASTURE AND OPEN RANGE. These lands have been delineated on the basis of cover (open grass- land) rather than use. They may not necessarily be used for grazing (e.g. remote meadows).
	WOODLAND. Land covered with tree or shrub growth. Woodland cover is derived from the most recent B.C. Forest Service Forest Cover maps available at time of mapping.
T ₁	- Mature Productive Woodland Immature Productive Woodland.
T ₂ U ₁	- Non-productive Woodland on a Productive Site. Forest land which has been logged, burned, or diseased and has either not been satisfact- orily restocked or has been restocked or has been a non-commercial species.
U ₂	 Non-productive Woodland on a non- productive site. These lands include alpine forest.
M	- SWAMP, MARSH AND BOG. Open wetlands except for those with evidence of haying or grazing in the drier years.
-	UNPRODUCTIVE LAND
S	 Depositional features with exposed sand surfaces predominating (e.g. sandbars).
L	- Erosional features such as rock and other relatively unvegetated surfaces. Areas with alpine vegetation are included here. Also included are ice and snow, and eroded river banks.
Х	- PERMANENT WATER BODIES. Lakes, ponds, and rivers included here.
