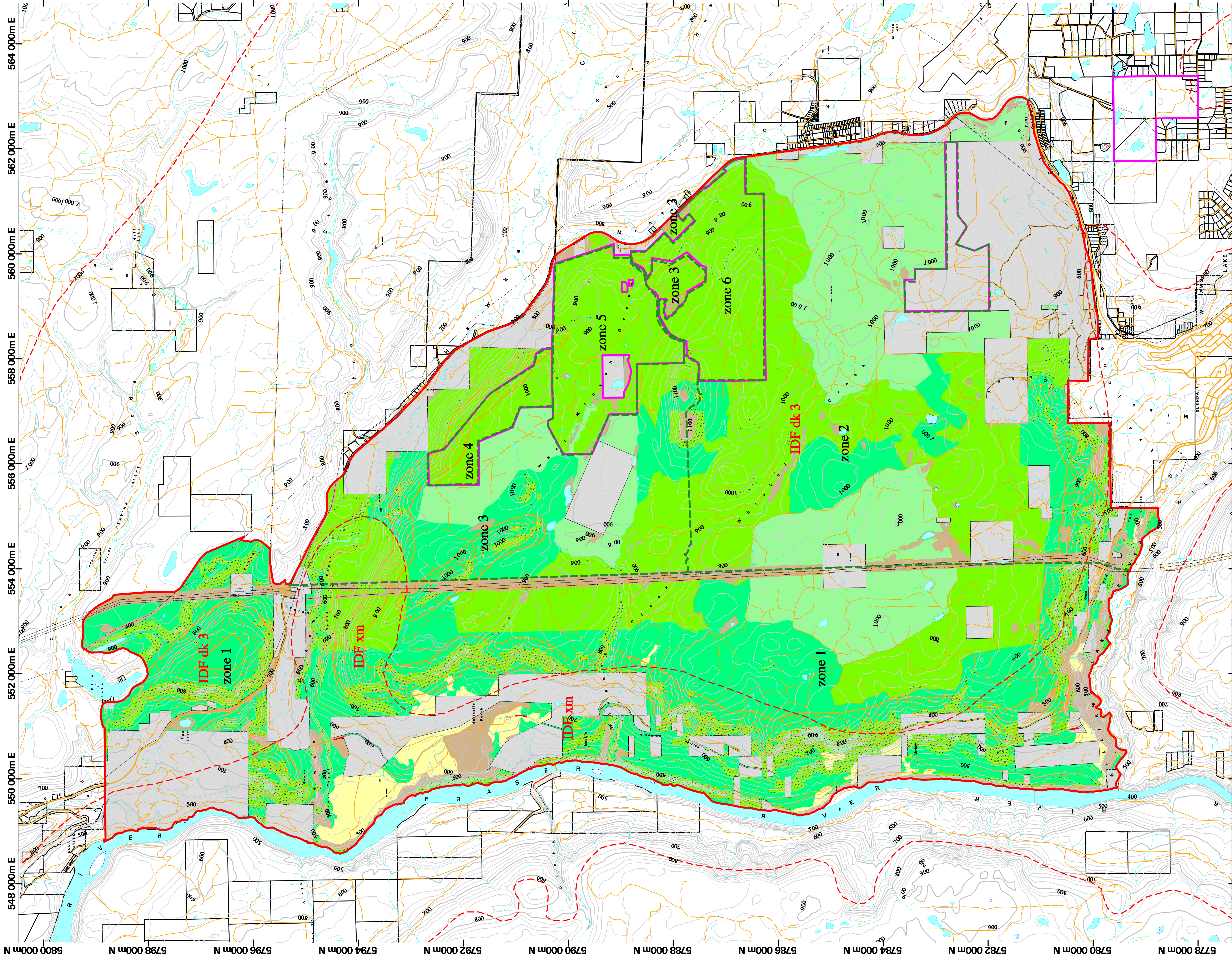
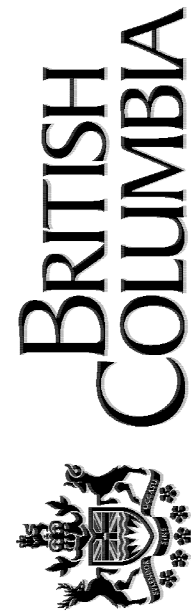

Special Management Direction:
Group selection (as described in Part 1b: Management Plan for Transition and Deep Snowpack Zones) is to be used on all slope and aspects in transition and deep snowpack zones. Also, on this winter range, group selection is to be used in the moderate snowpack zone on north-facing aspects (between 315 degrees and 60 degrees) that are greater than 20% slope.
