The staff specialists at the Conservation Data Centre, in cooperation with scientists and specialists throughout the province, have identified those animals, plants and plant communities in the province which have become most vulnerable. Each of these rare and endangered species and plant communities has been assigned a [global](#) (G) and [provincial](#) (S for "subnational") conservation status rank according to an objective set of criteria established by [The Nature Conservancy \(U.S.\)](#), and a status on the provincial [Red or Blue lists](#). The global rank is based on the status of the element throughout its entire range and is established by a biologist assigned to that element by TNC/ABI. The provincial rank is based solely on its status within British Columbia and is established by the B.C. CDC.

The status of each element is indicated on a scale of one to five. The score is based on the estimated number of extant occurrences of the element, and other factors such as trend, threats, and abundance. Generally speaking, the CDC will track only those species with ranks of 1 - 3.

Provincial Tracking Lists name all the rare, endangered, and vulnerable species and plant communities in the province, and gives their conservation status ranks and Red/Blue list status. These lists are updated once a year.

Forest District tracking lists name those vertebrates, vascular plants, and plant communities which are known to occur, strongly expected to occur, or which have occurred in the past within a given Forest District. Forest District lists are updated as necessary, to reflect current knowledge of element distribution. Due to lack of knowledge of distribution, there are no Forest District tracking lists for invertebrates or non-vascular plants.
