

## Province of British Columbia Water Act

## CONDITIONAL WATER LICENCE

The City of Coquitlam is hereby authorized to divert and use water as follows:

- a) The stream on which the rights are granted is Hoy Creek.
- b) The point of diversion is located as shown on the attached plan.
- c) The date from which this licence shall have precedence is April 10, 2014.
- d) The purpose for which this licence is issued is Industrial (sediment control).
- e) The maximum quantity of water which may be diverted for Industrial (sediment control) purpose is 1.4 cubic metres per second, subject to the following:
  - i. Downstream of the point of diversion and to the outlet of the sediment control pond, the weir elevation is to be such that the depth of water in the stream shall not be less than 0.12 metres along the thalweg, or a depth ordered by the Regional Water Manager;
    - a. The depth of water shall be monitored during the period of diversion; and
    - b. A summary monitoring report shall be provided within 60 days of the end of diversion, as a hard copy addressed to the Regional Water Manager; and
    - c. Upon submission of an analysis to the satisfaction of the Regional Water Manager, this monitoring program may be discontinued.
  - ii. Providing a minimum flow or water depth as ordered under clause (k).
- f) The period of the year during which the water may be used for Industrial (sediment control) purpose is October 1 to March 31.
- g) The land upon which the water is to be used and to which this licence is appurtenant is City of Coquitlam, Hoy Creek Linear Park as shown on Plan 62992, District Lot 386, Group 1, New Westminster District.
- h) The authorized works are diversion channel, weir, pipe, sediment pond and berm which shall be located approximately as shown on the attached plan.

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- i) The construction of the said works shall be completed and the water shall be beneficially used prior to December 31, 2015. Thereafter, the licensee shall continue to make regular beneficial use of the water in the manner authorized herein.
- j) The City of Coquitlam is permitted to perform regular sediment maintenance in the sediment pond, as specified in the "Hoy Creek Sediment Trap, Maintenance and Erosion and Sediment Control Plan" (ESCP), dated July 28, 2014, which includes any revisions thereafter approved by the Regional Water Manager.
  - All crew that work on sediment removal must have read and understood the requirements under the ESCP. A copy of this ESCP must be available for inspection, upon request, when instream works are occurring.
- k) The diversion of water authorized under this licence may be adjusted, restricted or prohibited at any time by an Order in writing by a Regional Water Manager under the Water Act, in order to maintain a minimum flow in the stream for the preservation of fish and other aquatic life.
