## *Water Act*

### CONDITIONAL WATER LICENCE

The owner of the land to which this licence is appurtenant is hereby authorized to divert, use and store water as follows:

- a) The stream on which the rights are granted is Kitsucksus Creek and storage is in a reservoir.
- b) The storage reservoir and the points of diversion (denoted by PD186544) and re-diversion (denoted by PD71129) are located as shown on the attached plan.
- c) The date from which this licence shall have precedence is March 25, 1926.
- d) The purposes for which this licence is issued are storage and industrial (log pond).
- e) The maximum quantity of water which may be diverted into storage is 3080 cubic metres per year and the maximum quantity which may be used for industrial (log pond) purpose is 1850 cubic metres per year.
- f) The period of the year during which the water may be diverted and held in storage is the whole year, and the period during which the stored water may be used for industrial (log pond) purpose is the whole year.
- g) The land upon which the water is to be used and to which this licence is appurtenant is Lot A, Loop Farms and District Lot 106, Alberni District, Plan VIP57991, except that part in Plan VIP65071.
- h) The authorized works are dam, reservoir, spillway, fish ladder, diversion structure, intake, pipe, diversion channel, which shall be located approximately as shown on the attached plan.
- i) The construction of the said works shall be completed and the water shall be beneficially used prior to December 31, 2017. Thereafter, the licensee shall continue to make regular beneficial use of the water in the manner authorized herein.
- j) The dam authorized under clause (h) is subject to the Dam Safety Regulations and shall be designed, constructed and maintained to the satisfaction of a Dam Safety Officer under the *Water Act*.
- k) This licence is issued in substitution of Conditional Water Licence C110613, in part.
