Water Act

CONDITIONAL WATER LICENCE

The owner of the land to which this licence is appurtenant is hereby authorized to divert water as follows:

- a) The sources on which the rights are granted are Scrubby Creek and Mountain Spring.
- b) The points of diversion are located as shown on the attached plan.
- c) The date from which this licence shall have precedence is May 29, 2014.
- d) The purpose for which this licence is issued is land improvement.
- e) The quantity of water which may be diverted for land improvement is the whole flow of Scrubby Creek and Mountain Spring.
- f) The period of the year during which water may be diverted is the whole year.
- g) The land upon which the water is to be used and to which this licence is appurtenant is District Lot 6999, Kootenay Land District.
- h) The authorized works are a diversion structure, diversion channel, culvert, pond, and pipe, which shall be located approximately as shown on the attached plan.
- i) The construction of the Mountain Spring diversion shall be completed, and the water shall be diverted by December 31, 2018. Thereafter, the licensee shall continue to divert the water in the manner authorized herein.

The construction of the Scrubby Creek diversion has been completed, and water is being diverted from Scrubby Creek to Corbin Creek. The licensee shall continue to divert the water in a manner authorized herein.

- j) This licence is issued under the Water Act (the Act). The exercise of rights under the licence is subject to the Act and its regulations, the terms and conditions of the licence, orders under the Act and the rights of licensees whose rights have precedence on the stream. The licensee must comply with all such requirements, as well as the provisions of all other applicable enactments. In exercising rights under the licence, the licensee must exercise reasonable care to avoid damaging land, works, trees or other property, and must make full compensation to the owners for damage or loss resulting from construction, maintenance, use, operation or failure of the works.

- k) This water licence does not authorize the disposal or discharge of mine effluent tailings.
- l) When the mining operation is completed, the licensee shall re-establish drainage in the area, to the satisfaction of an Engineer under the Water Act.
