Water Sustainability Act

CONDITIONAL WATER LICENCE

The owners of the land to which this licence is appurtenant are hereby authorized to divert and use water as follows:

- a) The stream on which the rights are granted is California Creek.
- b) The point of diversion is located as shown on the attached plan.
- c) The date from which this licence shall have precedence is September 25, 1998.
- d) The purposes for which this licence is issued are domestic and irrigation.
- e) The maximum quantity of water which may be diverted for domestic purposes is 2.273 cubic meters per day, and irrigation purposes is 71 170.355 cubic meters per year.
- f) The period of the year during which the water may be used for domestic purposes is the whole year, and for irrigation purposes is April 1 to September 30.
- g) The land upon which the water is to be used and to which this licence is appurtenant is District Lot 7210, Cassiar District, of which 24.281 hectares may be irrigated.
- h) The authorized works are screened intake, diversion structure, pipe, and irrigation system, which shall be located approximately as shown on the attached plan.
- i) The construction of the said works has been completed and the water is being used. The licensee shall continue to make regular beneficial use of the water in a manner authorized herein.
- j) This licence requires Park Use Permit No. 107596 issued under the *Park Act* to be valid in order to access the works located within the Omineca Protected Area. This Park Use Permit will expire December 31, 2044.
- k) This licence is issued in substitution of Conditional Water Licence C117770.

- 1) This licence is issued under the *Water Sustainability Act* (the Act). The exercise of rights under the licence is subject to the Act and its regulations, the terms and conditions of the licence, orders under the Act and the rights of licensees whose rights have precedence on the stream or on an aquifer. The licensee must comply with all such requirements, as well as the provisions of all other applicable enactments. In exercising rights under the licence, the licensee must exercise reasonable care to avoid damaging land, works, trees or other property, and must make full compensation to the owners for damage or loss resulting from construction, maintenance, use, operation or failure of the works.
