
Water Sustainability Act

CONDITIONAL WATER LICENCE

The owner(s) of the land to which this licence is appurtenant is/are hereby authorized to divert and use water as follows:

- a) The stream on which the rights are granted is Eustis Creek.
- b) The point of diversion is located as shown on the attached plan.
- c) The date from which this licence shall have precedence is August 25, 2008.
- d) The purpose for which this licence is issued is power (residential).
- e) The maximum quantity of water which may be diverted for power purposes is 0.030 cubic meters per second.
- f) The period of the year during which the water may be used is the whole year, while maintaining a minimum flow of 20% of the Mean Annual Discharge (MAD) directly below the intake. As of the date of issuance of this licence, the MAD has been determined to be 0.218 cubic meters per second and the minimum shall be 0.044 cubic meters per second. The requirement for minimum flow may be subject to change in the event that additional flow data or environmental impacts warrant a review of these flows.
- g) The land upon which the water is to be used and to which this licence is appurtenant is Lot 3, District Lot 6022, Cariboo District, Plan 25392.
- h) The authorized works are screened intake, diversion structure, pipe, powerhouse, and transmission line, which shall be located approximately as shown on the attached plan.
- i) The construction of the said works has been completed and the water is being used. The licensee shall continue to make regular beneficial use of the water in a manner authorized herein.
- j) The term of this licence is for 40 years from the original date of issuance (April 30, 2010).
- k) This Licence is issued in substitution of Conditional Water Licence C124212.

- 1) This licence is issued under the *Water Sustainability Act* (the Act). The exercise of rights under the licence is subject to the Act and its regulations, the terms and conditions of the licence, orders under the Act and the rights of licensees whose rights have precedence on the stream or on an aquifer. The licensee must comply with all such requirements, as well as the provisions of all other applicable enactments. In exercising rights under the licence, the licensee must exercise reasonable care to avoid damaging land, works, trees or other property, and must make full compensation to the owners for damage or loss resulting from construction, maintenance, use, operation or failure of the works.
