Water Sustainability Act

CONDITIONAL WATER LICENCE

The owner(s) of the land to which this licence is appurtenant is/are hereby authorized to divert and use water as follows:

- a) The stream on which the rights are granted is 3 Mile Creek.
- b) The point of diversion is located as shown on the attached plat.
- c) The date from which this licence shall have precedence is October 23rd, 1987.
- d) The purpose for which this licence is issued is power (residential).
- e) The maximum quantity of water which may be diverted is 0.05 cubic metres per second.
- f) Water may be used throughout the whole year.
- g) The land upon which water is to be used is in a powerhouse situated on and to which this license is appurtenant is Block B of District Lot 3246 Cassiar District.
- h) The authorized works are diversion structure, dam, penstock, powerhouse, tailrace, and ditch which shall be located approximately as shown on the attached plat.
- i) The construction of the said works has been completed and the water is being used. The licensee shall continue to make regular beneficial use of the water in a manner authorized herein.
- j) The term of this licence is 40 years from the date of issuance of the original licence (November 15, 1990).
- k) This Licence is issued in substitution of Conditional Water Licence C112431.
- l) The power generation pursuant to this licence may be supplied to one dwelling as shown on the attached plan.
- m) The water used in the generation of power shall be returned to the stream above any downstream points of diversion.

- n) This licence is issued under the *Water Sustainability Act* (the Act). The exercise of rights under the licence is subject to the Act and its regulations, the terms and conditions of the licence, orders under the Act and the rights of licensees whose rights have precedence on the stream. The licensee must comply with all such requirements, as well as the provisions of all other applicable enactments. In exercising rights under the licence, the licensee must exercise reasonable care to avoid damaging land, works, trees or other property, and must make full compensation to the owners for damage or loss resulting from construction, maintenance, use, operation or failure of the works.
- o) Water may only be used for residential power purposes so long as the Park Use Permit (No. 107595) is in good standing. Prior to the termination date of the Permit (December 31, 2044), you may apply to the Comptroller of Water Rights or the Water Manager in accordance with the provisions of the *Water Sustainability Act* to amend this licence to incorporate the terms and conditions of subsequent Park Use Permits.
