## *Water Sustainability Act*

### CONDITIONAL WATER LICENCE

The owner(s) of the land to which this licence is appurtenant is/are hereby authorized to divert and use water as follows:

- a) The stream on which the rights are granted is Kalamalka Lake.
- b) The point of diversion is located as shown on the attached plan.
- c) The date from which this licence shall have precedence is January 28, 2016.
- d) The purpose for which this licence is issued is Domestic.
- e) The maximum quantity of water which may be diverted for Domestic is 15 m<sup>3</sup>/year at a rate not to exceed 2.27 m<sup>3</sup>/day.
- f) The period of the year during which the water may be used is May 1 to September 30.
- g) The land upon which the water is to be used and to which this licence is appurtenant is Lot 54 District Lot 1272 Osoyoos Division Yale District Plan 8686.
- h) The authorized works are cistern (fully constructed), pipe (fully constructed), screened intake (fully constructed) and pump (fully constructed) which shall be located approximately as shown on the attached plan.
- i) The construction of the said works has been completed and the water is being beneficially used. The licensee shall continue to make regular beneficial use of the water in a manner authorized herein.
- j) The licensee shall install a flow metering or other measuring device to the satisfaction of an Engineer under the Water Sustainability Act.
- k) The licensee shall retain flow meter/measurement records for inspection upon request by an Engineer under the Water Sustainability Act.
- l) The works authorized under clause (h) hereof shall be constructed to operate with a lake elevation of 390.6 to 392.3 metres (1281.7 to 1287.0 feet) Geodetic Survey of Canada datum.

- m) The works authorized under clause (h) hereof shall be maintained to the satisfaction of an Engineer under the Water Sustainability Act.
  
- n) This licence is issued under the Water Sustainability Act (the Act). The exercise of rights under the licence is subject to the Act and its regulations, the terms and conditions of the licence, orders under the Act and the rights of licensees whose rights have precedence on the stream or on an aquifer. The licensee must comply with all such requirements, as well as the provisions of all other applicable enactments. In exercising rights under the licence, the licensee must exercise reasonable care to avoid damaging land, works, trees or other property, and must make full compensation to the owners for damage or loss resulting from construction, maintenance, use, operation or failure of the works.
