

Province of British Columbia Water Sustainability Act

WATER LICENCE

The owner(s) of the land to which this licence is appurtenant is/are hereby authorized to divert and use water as follows:

- a) The stream on which the rights are granted is Broadlands Spring.
- b) The point of diversion is located as shown on the attached plan.
- c) The date from which this licence shall have precedence is August 26, 2016.
- d) The purposes for which this licence is issued are Mineralized Water: Commercial Bathing Pools and Mineralized Water: Bottling & Commercial Distribution.
- e) The maximum quantity of water which may be diverted for Mineralized Water: Commercial Bathing Pools is 23.04 m3/day, and the maximum quantity which may be used for Mineralized Water: Bottling & Commercial Distribution is 5.76 m3/day.
- f) The period of the year during which the water may be used is January 1 to December 31.
- g) The land upon which the water is to be used and to which this licence is appurtenant is Lot C Section 25 Township 28 Similkameen Division Yale District Plan 34115.
- h) The authorized works are pipe, pond, and bottling facility which shall be located approximately as shown on the attached plan.
- i) The construction of the said works shall be completed and the water shall be beneficially used prior to December 31, 2020. Thereafter, the licensee shall continue to make regular beneficial use of the water in the manner authorized herein.
- j) The overflow of water diverted for Mineralized Water: Commercial Bathing Pools must be returned to the watershed approximately as shown on the attached plan.
- k) The licensee shall install a flow metering or other measuring device to the satisfaction of an Engineer under the *Water Sustainability Act*.
- 1) The licensee shall retain flow meter/measurement records for inspection upon request by

an Engineer under the Water Sustainability Act.

m) This licence is issued under the *Water Sustainability Act* (the Act). The exercise of rights under the licence is subject to the Act and its regulations, the terms and conditions of the licence, orders under the Act and the rights of licensees whose rights have precedence on the stream or on an aquifer. The licensee must comply with all such requirements, as well as the provisions of all other applicable enactments. In exercising rights under the licence, the licensee must exercise reasonable care to avoid damaging land, works, trees or other property, and must make full compensation to the owners for damage or loss resulting from construction, maintenance, use, operation or failure of the works.
