

## Province of British Columbia Water Sustainability Act

## CONDITIONAL WATER LICENCE

The owner of the land to which this licence is appurtenant is hereby authorized to divert and use water as follows:

- a) The stream on which the rights are granted is Tachintelachick Creek.
- b) The points of diversion are located as shown on the attached plan.
- c) The date from which this licence shall have precedence is February 9, 1968.
- d) The purposes for which this licence is issued are domestic and irrigation: private.
- e) The maximum quantity of water which may be diverted under this licence is 4.546 cubic metres per day for domestic and 24,669.60 cubic metres per year for irrigation subject to the following:
  - The licensee shall maintain in Tachintelachick Creek, measured immediately at the point of diversion:
  - 1. a minimum instream flow of 0.028 cubic metres per second; or
  - 2. a minimum instream flow as ordered under clause (1) by the Water Manager.
- f) The period of the year during which the water may be used for domestic is January 1 to December 31 and irrigation: private is April 1 to September 30.
- g) The land upon which the water is to be used and to which this licence is appurtenant is the South East 1/4 of the South West 1/4 of District Lot 1754, Cariboo District of which 8.094 hectares (20 acres) may be irrigated.
- h) The authorized works are diversion structure, screened Intake, pump, pipe, sprinklers which shall be located approximately as shown on the attached plan.
- i) The construction of the said works has been completed and the water is being beneficially used. The licensee shall continue to make regular beneficial use of the water in a manner authorized herein.
- j) This Licence is issued in substitution of Conditional Water Licence C40821.

- k) This licence authorizes the use of water for domestic purpose in 2 dwellings located approximately as shown on the attached plan.
- 1) This licence is issued under the *Water Sustainability Act* (the Act). The exercise of rights under the licence is subject to the Act and its regulations, the terms and conditions of the licence, orders under the Act and the rights of licensees whose rights have precedence on the stream or on an aquifer. The licensee must comply with all such requirements, as well as the provisions of all other applicable enactments. In exercising rights under the licence, the licensee must exercise reasonable care to avoid damaging land, works, trees or other property, and must make full compensation to the owners for damage or loss resulting from construction, maintenance, use, operation or failure of the works.
