
CONDITIONAL WATER LICENCE

The owner of the land to which this licence is appurtenant is hereby authorized to divert and use water as follows:


- (a) The streams on which the rights are granted are Scott Spring, Edward Spring and Maeser Spring.
- (b) The point of diversion is located as shown on the attached plan.
- (c) The date from which this licence shall have precedence is 15th August, 1997.
- (d) The purpose for which this licence is issued is domestic.
- (e) The maximum quantity of water which may be diverted is 1,500 gallons a day, being 500 gallons a day from Scott Spring, 500 gallons a day from Edward Spring and 500 gallons a day from Maeser Spring.
- (f) The water may be used throughout the whole year.
- (g) The land upon which the water is to be used and to which this licence is appurtenant is District Lot 9370, Kootenay District.
- (h) The works authorized to be constructed are diversion structures, tank and pipe, which shall be located approximately as shown on the attached plan.
- (i) The construction of the said works shall be completed and the water beneficially used prior to the 31st day of December, 2005. Thereafter, the licensee shall continue to make beneficial use of the water in the manner authorized herein.
- (j) This licence authorizes the use of water for domestic purpose in two dwellings and a barn located approximately as shown on the attached plan.

PERMIT OVER CROWN LAND
WATER ACT - Section 26

You are hereby authorized to enter onto and occupy Crown land for the purpose of constructing works, maintaining and operating works authorized by the above licence. The Crown land so occupied has a length of 1300 feet and a width of 15 feet.

The area authorized to be occupied is 0.45 acre.

This permit is issued subject to all subsisting rights of other persons acquired under other provincial legislation, whether or not the permit holder has actual notice of them.
